"Repent and believe the good news."

Something to Think About

Jesus said to Simon and Andrew, "Come with me!"
Close your eyes and imagine Jesus saying these same words to you.
How would you respond to this invitation from Jesus?

The Story

In today's gospel story, Jesus tells the people to change their ways and turn back to God. Then Jesus walks near Lake Galilee where he sees Simon and Andrew casting their fishing nets into the lake. Jesus says to them, "Come with me!" Jesus wants them to help him spread the Good News and bring people to God. Simon and Andrew immediately follow Jesus. Later, Jesus sees James and John and calls them as well. James and John leave what they are doing, and go with Jesus.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark 1:14-20

After John was arrested,

Jesus went to Galilee and told the good news that comes from God.

He said, "The time has come!

God's kingdom will soon be here.

Turn back to God and believe the good news!"

As Jesus was walking along the shore of Lake Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew.

They were fishermen and were casting their nets into the lake.

Jesus said to them, "Come with me!

I will teach you how to bring in people instead of fish."

Right then the two brothers dropped their nets and went with him.

Jesus walked on and soon saw James and John, the sons of Zebedee.

They were in a boat, mending their nets. At once Jesus asked them to come with him.

They left their father in the boat with the hired workers and went with him.

Group Discussion

Talk about what it means to 'drop everything' (to stop a current activity abruptly and do something else, to have a sudden change of plans).

Think about some situations that might cause someone to 'drop everything'.

Why are we sometimes willing to change our plans? What does the decision to 'drop everything' reveal about our priorities? Simon, Andrew, James and John immediately changed their plans and followed Jesus because they thought he was the most important thing.

What actions would show that following Jesus is the most important thing in your life?

Group Activity

You will need: one printed fish template for each child, paints, coloured markers or crayons, glitter glue.
