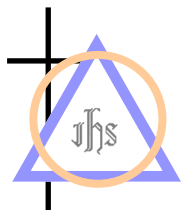

The Word of God for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Wealth and blessing

There is a variety of views on wealth and riches in the Bible. First, some background. For most of the biblical period, there was no concept of a life after death (see Easter 3). Therefore, if God wanted to reward the righteous and punish the wicked, God must act in this life. The reward for righteous living, i.e., keeping the commandments, is blessing: 'blessings are on the head of the righteous' (Proverbs 10:6); blessings included long life and prosperity (Deuteronomy 4:40; 5:33), children (Psalms 127:3-5; 128:1-6), health (Sirach 34:17-18,) and wealth: 'It is the Lord's blessing that brings wealth' (Proverbs 10:22). If righteousness brings blessing, then it seems only natural to conclude that one who is blessed must be righteous. The disciples in this Sunday's gospel are apparently of this mindset. The fact that the man 'had many possessions' confirms his claim to have kept all the commandments from his youth: obviously, he is righteous and has therefore been blessed by God. The disciples conclude that if anyone is a candidate to 'inherit eternal life' and 'enter the kingdom of God,' it is surely this man. Jesus' observation, 'How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God' left the disciples 'exceedingly astonished.' If the wealthy - so obviously blessed - aren't saved, then 'who can be saved?'

But the Bible has other things to say about wealth. The prophets denounce wealth obtained by robbery, extortion, cheating, and other illegal means (Amos 4:1; 5:11; 8:4; Isa 3:13-15; 5:8; 10:1-2). The Wisdom tradition is suspicious of wealth for it distracts one from God and tempts one to evil deeds: 'The lover of gold will not be free from sin, for he who pursues wealth is led astray by it' (Sir 31:5; see also Proverbs 29:13; 30:7; Sirach 31:1-11). Jesus is aware that the wealthy man has become attached to his possessions and could not give them up. Jesus expects his disciples to be able to give up much more than wealth: they, like Jesus himself, will be required to give up their very life (Mark 8:35-37).

ATTENDING MASS UNDER CURRENT COVID RESTRICTIONS

In line with current Government COVID-19 restrictions, our numbers for Mass have been reduced to 100 people at Corpus Christi Church, Nundah and 75 at Holy Trinity Church, Banyo.
