# The Word of God for the 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. 'Cup' and 'baptism'

What precedes this Sunday's gospel is the third prediction of the passion (see Sunday 25). Even after having been told three times that Jesus must suffer and die, James, John, and all the disciples fail to understand Jesus' identity and mission: all they can think about is glory. Hence, Jesus again instructs them about discipleship, this time speaking of 'the cup that I drink' and 'the baptism with which I am baptised.' These are images for his forthcoming suffering and death.

Cup. In the Old Testament the image of the cup is used to describe the suffering and punishment God visits upon the wicked: 'You drank at the Lord's hand the cup of his wrath: Desolation and destruction, famine and sword!' (Isaiah 51:17, 19; also Psalm 11:6; Jeremiah 25:15; Habakkuk 2:16; Ezekiel 23:31-33). The 'cup' that Jesus drinks may infer that Jesus took on himself the punishment intended for human sinfulness. He seems to indicate this when he says that he will 'give his life as a ransom for many' (Mark 10:45). Additionally, at the Last Supper Jesus says of the cup, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many' (14:24) - indicating that the cup, 'shed for many,' is also a cup of suffering. 'Cup' understood as suffering is evident in his prayer in Gethsemane, 'Take this cup away from me' (Mark 14:36). Finally, it was customary for the head of a household to fill the cups of the family and guests at table. So the cup that Jesus obligingly pours out for James and John is the cup of suffering - and each, indeed, dies a martyr's death.

Baptism. In the Old Testament a deluge of water symbolises trouble and suffering (Psalms 18:17-18; 32:6; 69:2-3, 15; 124:4-5; Isaiah 8:7). John the Baptist uses 'baptism' with other images to signify the tribulations of the end time (Matthew 3:11-12). Jesus, too, uses baptism to describe his own anguish and suffering (Luke 12:50). As a symbol of Christ's death, it may refer to the sacrament of baptism by which disciples are baptised into Christ's death (Romans 6:3 -4).



### SYNOD OF BISHOPS

On Sunday, October 17, dioceses around the world will launch local preparations for the Synod of Bishops, which has the theme: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission". The Catholic Church in Australia will invite the People of God to make submissions via an online portal that will open on October 17. Those submissions will help the Bishops develop a national report to support the global process leading to an international gathering in 2023. Find out more at:

### Ditching Teabags and Starting a Tea Garden

Did you know that most teabags contain plastic? Many people think that teabags are just made from paper and string but most brands have plastic in the bag which prevents it disintegrating when it goes into boiling water. So given that we generally only use them once, perhaps it's worth considering an alternative.

Switching to loose leaf tea from the supermarket or the closest bulk food supply store is one option, but if you happen to have a green thumb or even just an interest in learning, you may like to grow your own tea garden.

There's lots of things you could try, but a few great options to start with include lemon verbena, lemon myrtle, peppermint and rosella. The leaves of the first three and the flower buds (pre-opening) of the rosella are what's used to make tea. Simply add a few leaves/buds to some hot water and let it brew for a while. For a stronger flavour just add more.

Perhaps you could make a start on a tea garden this weekend...
