Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B 31st October 2021

Annual Holidays. I'm Back! I have enjoyed a restful holiday which consisted of walking, sleeping, eating, drinking, reading, swimming (almost every day) and praying (every day). Thank you for keeping me in your prayers which have kept me out of trouble and have brought me back safe and sound. Thank you for looking after Mgr. John Grace and Fr. Frank Jones who supplied Masses and pastoral care while I was away.

The Word of God for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Mark has two distinctive features:

- 1. Jesus begins his quotation of the Law with the Shema, 'Listen Israel . . .' The inclusion of the Shema roots the observance of these great commandments in the prayer life of Israel and links it to the primary affirmation of Israel's confession of faith: God is God alone. Thus, both prayer and faith find their fulfilment in the love of God, neighbour, and self.
- 2. The scribe affirms the surpassing value of these commandments to the offering of sacrifice. Love and sacrifice come together on the cross where the love of Jesus attains its most perfect expression. For disciples, then and now, the greatest commandment not only sums up the life and teaching of Jesus, it identifies the path of discipleship as the way of love.

Coronavirus Time and Vaccinations. Jesus' words to the scribe who asked about the greatest commandment "You are not far from the kingdom of God" are meant for us hear and note. If we want to live in the kingdom of God then we must love God and our neighbour. An important way of showing our love for one another is to follow the health advice about being vaccinated. The clergy of the Archdiocese of Brisbane were informed by email this past week that "It is the Archbishop's expectation that all clergy in the Archdiocese of Brisbane be vaccinated against COVID-19 unless they have an official medical exemption." In the email a video message from Pope Francis was quoted: "Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most vulnerable. I pray to God that everyone may contribute their own small grain of sand, their own small gesture of love." As of June 12th I have been fully vaccinated and I presume the same of all parishioners, unless officially medically exempted. I thank all of you for your 'Coronavirus Patience' and for your acceptance of constantly changing rules and regulations in regard to your celebration of Holy Mass. On your behalf I offer a special thank you to our parish secretary Madonna Riggall who is keeping the parish up to date with all the changes. We look forward to December 17th and a Christmas when family and friends can enjoy the festive season and the hope that faith in the incarnation brings.

Holy Trinity Church, Banyo. While I was away on holidays a couple of projects of interest to those who attend Holy Trinity church commenced. Work has begun on the erection of a cross to replace the original cross that became dangerous and had to be removed. 
