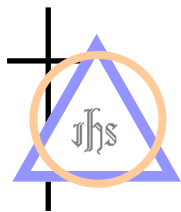

Daniel and end times

Both Daniel and Jesus are talking about the end times. The 'unsurpassed distress' and 'tribulation' that accompany the end — the darkening of sun and moon, the falling of stars, the shaking of the heavenly powers — are part of the apocalyptic worldview. This kind of literature typically appears when the present seems hopeless and is usually the product of a minority group experiencing persecution. Such was the time when the book of Daniel was written. Though the narrative is set during the Babylonian Exile (597-539 B.C.), scholars think the book was written during the persecution of the Jews under Antiochus Epiphanes who ruled Palestine from 175-164 B.C. He prohibited the offering of sacrifice to Yahweh and he made observance of the Sabbath a crime; he ordered Torah scrolls to be burned; he set up pagan altars and placed a statue of Zeus in the Temple. This resulted in a popular revolt led by Judas Maccabeus who defeated Antiochus, purified the Temple, and rededicated it in 164 B.C. — an event commemorated in the Jewish feast of Chanukah.

In this Sunday's first reading Daniel describes the role played by Michael, the captain of the heavenly host. Michael also appears in the Book of Revelation where he battles Satan, hurling him and his angels down to earth (Rev 12:7-9). In both Daniel and Revelation this heavenly battle takes place at the end of time. Yet in the traditions that develop later — immortalised in Milton's 'Paradise Lost' — this battle is transferred to the beginning of time and explains how Satan entered the world which, in turn, led to the temptation of Adam and Eve. In this sense time is relative: the end and the beginning are simply moments in the unfolding of God's sovereignty over all things, even time. The passing of this world marks the inauguration of the world to come. Cataclysm and tribulation are, from this perspective, merely the birth pangs of a new reality. What seems so calamitous to us simply heralds the 'Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory.'

World Day of the Poor – November 14. The most vulnerable when it comes to climate change and coronavirus are the poor of the world. You can read Pope Francis' message for this year's World Day of the Poor by searching <World Day of the Poor 2021> .

Pope Francis addresses COP26. "All too many of our brothers and sisters are suffering from this climate crisis. The lives of countless people, particularly those who are

most vulnerable, have experienced its increasingly frequent and devastating effects. At the same time, we have come to realize that it also involves a crisis of children's rights and that, in the near future, environmental migrants will be more numerous than refugees from war and conflicts." He therefore called on the leaders "to act, urgently, courageously and responsibly" if the goals written in the Paris Agreement are to be achieved in a coordinated and responsible manner: "Those goals are ambitious, and they can no longer be deferred. Today it is up to you to take the necessary decisions." His Holiness also spoke of the ecological debt. "Special care must likewise be shown for the most vulnerable peoples, in whose regard there is a growing 'ecological debt' related to commercial imbalances with environmental repercussions and to the disproportionate use of the natural resources of one's own and of other countries. There is no denying this."

National Church Life Survey

Soon thousands of churches across Australia, including 300 Catholic parishes, will participate in the 2021 National Church Life Survey. Our parish has been invited to participate this year. The survey is designed to listen to your views as parishioners and to provide a picture of a parish's health and vitality. It will be held one Sunday at homily time. The survey provides information on a wide range of topics about a parish. These include:

- Who is coming to Mass, their age groups and gender, education, migrant background and employment?
- What parishioners currently value in the parish
- What they see as priorities for the future
- How parishioners relate to God through prayer, the Mass etc.
- Current involvement of parishioners
- Percentage of parishioners who are growing in their faith
- Who is outreaching to the community and how
- Relationships with other parishioners – how strong is your community?

This information will return to our parish in well-presented reports. These Survey Reports will help identify our parish strengths and areas for improvement, and a Church Life Pack will provide processes to help our parish evaluate, make decisions and continue to grow our parish as a community of Missionary Disciples.

The End Is Nearer! Next Sunday is the last Sunday of the Church's Liturgical Year and the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. "The picture of Christ as King is powerful and majestic. We honour the Lord Jesus Christ as a King whose Kingdom is eternal in time, universal in scope and very personal in its power. That is the teaching of the scripture readings for this Sunday." (Captured Fire – The Sunday Homilies – Cycle B) Read: Daniel 7:13-14; Revelation 1:5-8; John 18:33-37.
