## Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Year B 21<sup>st</sup> November 2021

Acknowledgement of Country

'We, the parishioners of the Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish, acknowledge the Turrbal People who are the Traditional Custodians of this land. We pay respect to the Elders past, present and future and extend that respect to other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People present.

The End Is Here. On this last Sunday of the Church year we give thanks to God for the blessing of Catholic faith. The solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe celebrates faith in Jesus who is the beginning and the end of all that is. We give him all honour and glory. "I am the Alpha and the Omega' says the Lord God, who is, who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." (Apocalypse 1:8) Jesus, on the other hand, reigns among us as God's suffering servant, crowned with thorns and from a cross as his throne.

#### The Word of God for the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Daniel and the son of man

In his visions Daniel 'saw One like a son of man coming, on the clouds of heaven.' Though the 'son of man' usually refers to 'a human being' (Job 25:6; Isaiah 56:2; Ezekiel 2:1), here he is clearly a heavenly being ('coming on the clouds of heaven'). His appearance in human form is in striking contrast to four terrifying beasts (a grotesque lion, bear, leopard, and the fourth beast, unspeakably horrible) which represent successive kingdoms on earth. Each kingdom inflicts terrible harm on God's holy ones. Then 'the Ancient One' appears and takes his throne: 'his clothing was snow bright, and the hair on his head as white as wool; His throne was flames of fire, with wheels of burning fire' (7:9). His mere appearance destroys the fourth beast and deprives the others of their dominion. Then, this mysterious 'son of man' receives royal powers: 'dominion, glory, and kingship; nations and peoples of every language serve him' (7:14).

As this title is used in New Testament writings, the 'Son of Man' sometimes refers to Daniel's heavenly figure and is associated with the end times. He functions as God's proxy, exercising royal and judicial functions by establishing a just rule and executing judgment on both the righteous and the wicked. The royal aspects of this title are highlighted by this solemnity: in addition to the specific language in Daniel ('dominion', 'kingship'), Pilate's interrogation of Jesus in John's gospel concerns the kind of kingship Jesus exercises.

But this is not the whole story. The 'Son of Man,' in

addition to the meanings described above (a human being, a royal figure of the end times), also refers to the suffering messiah. As we have seen (Sunday 25), the title 'Son of Man' is how Jesus refers to himself in his three passion predictions: it is associated with his suffering and death. Thus, even as we celebrate the dominion, glory, and kingship of Christ, it must never be forgotten that he is a King who reigns from a cross and whose crown is made of thorns.

Covid-19 Vaccinations. In less than a month Catholics, along with fellow Queenslanders, will commence living with Covid-19. We can expect different rules for coming together for all acts of worship (Sacraments) and for offering our service as parish volunteers. Being vaccinated will be at the forefront of our public practice of the faith. All of our parish staff and some of our volunteers are required to be vaccinated. The parish office will contact the volunteers who must be vaccinated by email this week. Archbishop Mark Coleridge has requested that this (vaccination) occur before December 15th. If our parish gatherings are to include the non-vaccinated we will have to continue to limit the numbers in our churches for all acts of worship. With Christmas in mind it would be good to be open to all who wish to worship.

**Parish Finance Council Report.** Mrs Jenny Davissen and Mr. Peter Gordon reported on both our parish schools, St. Joseph Nundah and St. Pius V Banyo; the state of parish finances indicate that the parish is managing during this difficult time; the parish is benefiting from income from both Outside School Hours Care providers; since our last meeting (19 August) there has not been a lot of progress in regard to the restoration of Corpus Christi Church; there are various works at Banyo including the erection of the Holy Trinity Church Cross which should happen before Christmas and prices are to be obtained for the interior painting of the Banyo parish house; thanks to a generous gift from a parish family for the provision of solar panels on the Banyo parish house.
