**Acknowledgement of Country** 

'We, the parishioners of the Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish, acknowledge the Turrbal People who are the Traditional Custodians of this land. We pay respect to the Elders past, present and future and extend that respect to other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People present.

As the Season of Advent ends let us remember how the prophets have encouraged our reflective preparation for Christmas. Jeremiah (1st Sunday of Advent): "I will make a virtuous Branch grow for David"; Baruch (2nd Sunday) "Jerusalem take off your dress of sorrow and distress.......for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory" and Isaiah "A voice cries in the wilderness 'Prepare a way for the Lord"; Zephaniah (3rd Sunday) "The Lord your God is in your midst"; and today's Micah "You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel;" Let us join the prophets in this final week of preparation for the birth of the savior of the world.

# The Word of God for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent. Infancy and passion:

Especially so close to Christmas, the second reading from Hebrews is jarring. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, the letter to the Hebrews speaks of his death. This passage begins, however, with two references to his birth: when Christ came into the world and 'prepared a body for me'. Why did Christ come? Why did he take on a human body? The answer: 'I am coming to obey your will'. Through obedience to the will of God, Jesus established a new covenant. Obedience is the key: the extent of obedience is demonstrated by his death on the cross. This connection between the birth of Jesus and his obedience unto death is integral to the Christmas festival. In the annunciation Mary responds to the words of Gabriel by saying, 'I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word' (1:38; this Sunday's gospel acclamation). By obediently submitting to the divine word, she puts her body at the disposal of God: 'you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus' (1:31). Submission to God's will makes possible the birth that will lead to salvation. The birth of the Messiah and the death of the Saviour are inseparable. Elizabeth's question to Mary is really a proclamation of faith: 'Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?' The reference to Jesus as 'Lord' is an Easter title, indicating that Luke is telling the initial episodes of the gospel in view of the entire story. The resurrection is not a sur-prise ending: it is

where the story really begins and the vantage point from which the gospel is proclaimed. The story of the birth of Jesus cannot be separated from the story of his death. Christ was born for a purpose: 'I am coming to obey your will, O God' (Hebrews 10:7, 9). Birth leads to death as surely as death leads to life.

Christmas Masses and the Sacrament of Penance. The times for Christmas Masses and 1st Rite of Reconciliation are advertised in this newsletter. As was the case last year, with one exception, attending Christmas Mass will involve using the Trybooking website. For those who do not have access to the internet phone bookings can be made. The exception is for the Christmas Eve Carols and Mass at Banyo. Instead of using the Holy Trinity church we will use the St. Pius V school open multi-purpose area. We can only cater for 200 people in Corpus Christi church and 150 in Holy Trinity church. It is not permitted for people to stand outside. Please note the Saturday (Christmas) evening Mass at 6pm in Corpus Christi church is NOT a Christmas Mass. It is the Mass for the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

The First Rite of the Sacrament of Penance is offered in Holy Trinity church, Banyo. The 'Confessional' at Corpus Christi church is not suitable for social distancing and sanitizing requirements. The session is on **Tuesday 21**<sup>st</sup> **6-8pm.** As well, it will be possible to make a confession during 6.30pm Banyo Mass on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> and 9am Nundah Mass on Friday 24<sup>th</sup>.

Queenslander! Our borders are open to vaccinated and tested interstate visitors. Lots of Queenslanders will enjoy the experience of reuniting with family and friends who have not been able to visit for such a long time. The opening of our borders is possible because of the high percentage of vaccinated Queenslanders. Please get vaccinated and play your part in promoting the health and well-being of yourself and others including fellow parishioners.

**Hospitality.** It has been some time since we have been able to offer the hospitality of a Morning Tea after the 9.30am Mass in Corpus Christi church. This month the practice is recommencing and I thank those groups, The Voice (Youth) – 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of each month, the Pilipino Community – (2<sup>nd</sup>), the Seniors – (3<sup>rd</sup>) and the Chai Group - (4<sup>th</sup>) who provide the opportunity for socializing after Mass.


