Acknowledgement of Country

The Sacred Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord shines forth as the high point of the entire liturgical year. The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday which leads into Good Friday. The Triduum has as its centre the celebration of the Easter Vigil and closes with Vespers (Evening Prayer) of the Sunday of the Resurrection. During the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper the liturgical gesture of washing feet ritualises the Christian ideal of a leadership of service, a service which Christ expresses fully by laying down his life on the cross. During the Friday of the Passion of the Lord Christians gather at 3pm for the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The Easter Vigil celebration commences in darkness to highlight the Service of Light with its New Fire, Paschal Candle, Procession into a darkened church and Easter Proclamation. After the Liturgy of the Word, the Baptismal Liturgy celebrates the welcome of new Catholics into our midst and the Renewal of our baptismal Promises. This year we welcome into our Catholic family: Leonie Porter and Prashant Murphy (Catechumens to be baptized and confirmed); and Blythe Moore and Troy Lockett (Candidates to be confirmed); all four will then receive Holy Communion with us for the first time. Leonie's two daughters, Eva and Chloe will also be baptised. During Easter Sunday Masses (7.30am Banyo and 9.30am Nundah) all will renew Baptismal Promises. NB There is no Sunday evening 5pm Mass at Banyo.

Easter Time. The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one 'great Sunday'. These are the days above all others in which the Alleluia is sung. The Sundays of this time of the year are considered to be Sundays of Easter.

Mass times Easter Week. Please note that there is no Mass on Monday and Wednesday morning during Easter Week.

Term 2 of the Academic Year commences for our parish primary and high schools on Tuesday. We wish a successful and safe time for all students, parents, teachers and school staff.

Archbishop Coleridge. Easter tells a great story, but it's never once upon a time. It's always here and now. We celebrate this Easter in a world that was just beginning to emerge from the pandemic when it entered a time of war that leaves world peace looking fragile. Such a world can seem hopeless, just as things seemed hopeless to the first Christians when they saw Jesus die on the Cross. But Easter is always and everywhere because new hope is born against the odds from what seems hopeless. That's why on Easter night we light the fire in the darkness.

Archbishop Charles Balvo has arrived as Pope Francis' ambassador to Australia in what the 70-year-old believes will be his final assignment after having served 35 years in the Vatican's diplomatic service.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, Archbishop Balvo presented his credentials to the Governor-General on April 1 - the 17th anniversary of his first appointment as an Apostolic Nuncio, to New Zealand and the islands of the Pacific.

He has also served as papal ambassador to Kenya and South Sudan and, most recently, to the Czech Republic. He had held earlier diplomatic postings to Latin America, the Baltic States, Africa and the Middle East.



THE GREEN CORNER

This Lent, the Laudato Si committee has been promoting purchase of certified chocolate in order to prevent child slavery in the cocoa industry. Our key message is to purchase chocolate with the FairTrade, UTZ or Rainforest Alliance logos, with Aldi having many choices of certified chocolate products. You may be wondering, why has this got to do with Laudato Si? Isn't Laudato Si just about the environment?

Pope Francis in Laudato Si calls for us to hear both the cry of the Earth and the cry of the Poor. He points out the complex interrelationship between the natural environment and its people. From the book of Genesis we learn that creation is not just the environment we live in, but that we are part of it. Creation is not an object to be studied, but rather "it has to do with God's loving plan in which every creature has its own value and significance". This interconnectedness means that our care for the environment is only one part of an integral ecology. We must at the same time defend all human life, as to ignore is to ignore the cry of nature itself.

So this Easter, we hope you take a moment for both the environment and for other people, and enjoy the sweet sweet taste of certified chocolate!
