### Something to Think About

Fire changes things!

Have you ever seen pictures of Australian bushfires and how they change the landscape?

### The Story

Jesus tells the people that things need to change. He makes it clear that disciples of Jesus have choices to make, and that following Jesus won't always be easy. Jesus is calling the people to help the poor and suffering, to love their enemies, to choose Jesus even over their own family members.

### The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

12:49-53

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I came to set fire to the earth,  
and I surely wish it were already on fire!  
"I am going to be put to a hard test.  
And I will have to suffer a lot of pain until it is over.  
"Do you think that I came to bring peace to earth?  
No indeed!  
I came to make people choose sides.  
A family of five will be divided,  
with two of them against the other three.  
Fathers and sons will turn against one another,  
and mothers and daughters will do the same.  
Mothers-in-law and daughters-in-law  
will also turn against each other."

## Group Discussion

**All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Invite the children to pray for their own special intentions.*

**All: Lord hear our prayer.**

*Leader:* Loving God, listen to the prayers we make in the name of Jesus.

**All: Amen.**

## Group Activity

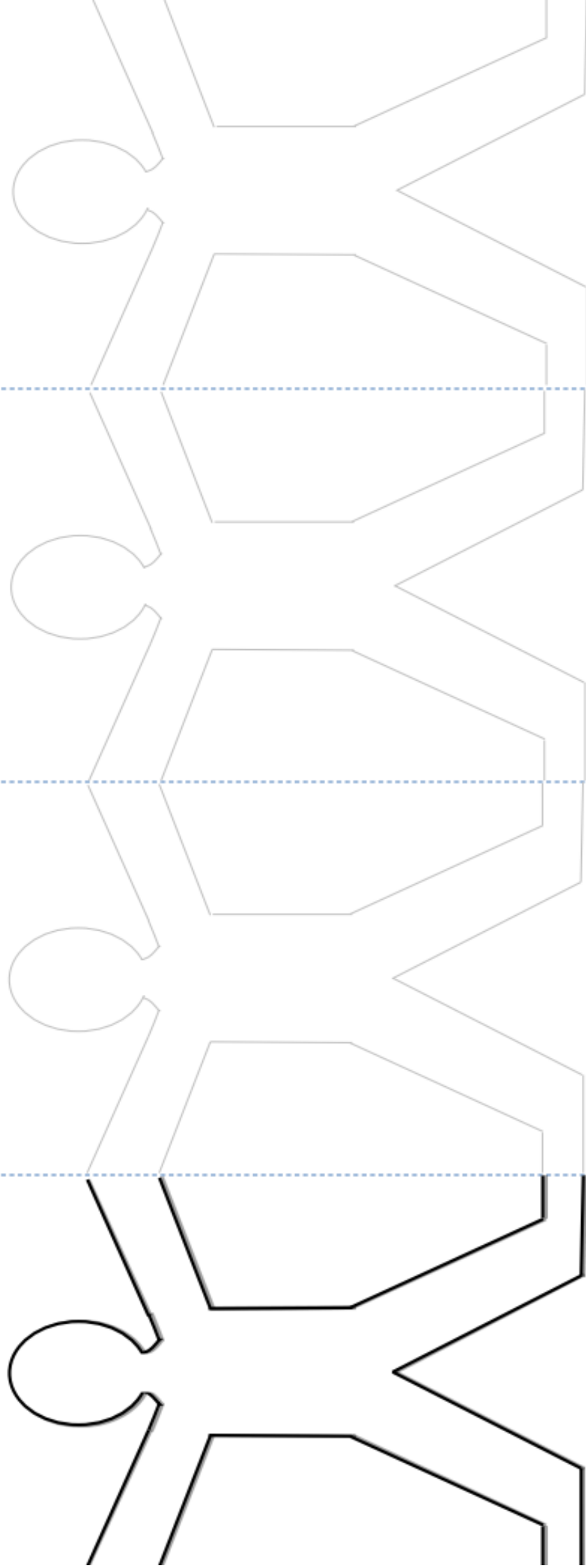
### Paper People Chain – United in following Jesus

*You will need: a template for each child printed on paper, scissors, coloured markers.*

1. Print templates for each child.
2. Fold the piece of paper in half with the printed outlines on the inside.
3. Fold the two quarter panels on each end toward the outside to make an accordion-style fold.
4. Cut around the first figure which you see on the top fold, but do not cut along the fold lines.
5. Children decorate the people after stretching out their paper people chain.
