Acknowledgement of Country

Second Sunday of Advent. Repentance and the kingdom

Both John the Baptist and Jesus preached the necessity of repenting and both cited the same reason: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand' (John's words in this Sunday's gospel, Matthew 3:2; Jesus' words, 4:17 Sunday 3).

Matthew, like other NT writers, believed that the world was under the control of Satan. This belief is reflected in Matthew 12:29, where Satan is the 'strong man' who owns the house (= the world); in order for the house and property to be wrested from his powerful grasp, someone stronger (= Jesus) must first tie him up. Until that time people live under Satan's rule. But, John the Baptist proclaims, all that is about to change! Why? The kingdom of heaven has drawn near (3:2)! It is time to change one's mind (= 'repent') about who is in charge.

All this implies a world view in which there are two opposing kingdoms — the kingdom of Satan vs. the kingdom of heaven. Each person must make a decision about which kingdom to serve. It is not possible to serve both; it is not possible to serve neither. The decision to turn away from the kingdom of this world towards the kingdom of heaven is what the word 'repent' implies. The decision to repent is not made in a vacuum; it is made in view of something that is already happening: the kingdom of God is 'at hand.' God has made the first move; the appropriate response to God's activity is to 'repent.'

God's kingdom has already made an incursion into this world through the ministry of John; he is its vanguard. With the arrival of Jesus, the battle will be joined (see the temptations of Jesus, Matthew 4:1-11 - Lent 1). At stake is God's rule over the world. A glimpse of the world under God's rule is given in the breathtaking vision of Isaiah in the first reading — a world living in peace and harmony with all nations under the rule of God. The way into this kingdom is heralded by John: Repent! The kingdom is at hand!

Parish Pastoral Council Meeting. The following are some of the matters dealt with and discussed: the parish welcome for Fr. Dan Redhead who commences his appointment as Parish Priest on January 7thproviding him with a handover document containing relevant information; the sanctuary setting in Corpus Christi church was discussed - it was decided to invite archdiocesan theologians and liturgists to provide information sessions so that parishioners can be better informed in regard to the worship of God in keeping with the reforms of the Second Vatican Council; the furthering of parish action plans in regard to Reconciliation and Environment are works in progress; a Sacramental Coordinator Report was tabled; a Religious Instruction Coordinator Report was tabled; Fr. Bernie raised the need for the parish to be prepared for the implementation phase of the Fifth Plenary Council of the Catholic Church in Australia -notice was given of an Archdiocesan Summit in May 2023; and to be prepared for the Synod on Synodality to be held in Rome in 2023; a letter of congratulations and prayerful support is to be sent to our newly ordained deacons; mention was made of new APRE (Assistant to the Principal Religious Education) appointments for both of our parish schools of St. Joseph, Nundah and St. Pius V, Banyo. Parishioners are encouraged to participate in the recently launched Catholic Formation initiative of the Archdiocese noting the ease of access to Holy Spirit Seminary and Australian Catholic University. Fr. Bernie concluded the meeting by thanking the Pastoral Council members for their important role in building parish community and identity.

Fr. Dan Redhead will commence his appointment as Parish Priest of the Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish on January 7th, 2023.
