Acknowledgement of Country

The Word of God for the 3rd Sunday of Advent. Messiah.

In Hebrew 'messiah' means 'the anointed one'; in Greek, 'messiah' is 'christos.' 'Christ,' therefore, is not Jesus' last name: it is a title meaning 'Jesus the anointed or messiah.' In the gospel when the Baptist asks about the works of the Christ, he is wondering whether Jesus is the Messiah.

In the Old Testament the term 'anointed one' usually refers to the king (Psalms 28:8; 89:21). The last two historical figures the Old Testament names as 'anointed' were Cyrus, the Persian King who liberated the Jews from their Babylonian captivity (Isaiah 45:1), and the unnamed prophet of Isaiah 61:1. In some passages 'anointed' refers to priests (Exodus 40:15; Leviticus 6:15) or to future kingly and priestly anointed rulers (Zechariah 4:14, which uses a different word for 'anointed'). Early Jewish thought envisioned a future Davidic king who would free Israel from political oppression (i.e., Roman domination) and establish the kingdom in justice (Psalms of Solomon 17:21-46).

In the New Testament, some Jews looked to Jesus as the political messiah who would restore their kingdom (Mark 11:10; Acts 1:6). Against these overt political expectations Jesus in the gospel refers to the passage from Isaiah that is this Sunday's first reading. This passage does two things: first, it clarifies that Jesus' messianic role is not political: it is rather 'to save' the weak, blind, deaf, and lame. Second, astonishingly, the work Isaiah ascribes to God is now fulfilled by Jesus. Isaiah says, 'Here is your God' (Isaiah 35:4); in the gospel Jesus in effect says, 'Here I am: the messiah doing as God does.'

Judge

James equates the 'Lord's coming' [*parousia*] with the 'Judge ... waiting at the gates.' The image of the judge highlights an aspect of royal rule, for kings were also judges. Judgment points to Christ's sovereignty and authority. 'Judge' is an image of the exalted Christ exercising rule.

The Sacrament of Penance. In the lead up to Christmas when Repentance is one of the preparatory themes our

thoughts turn to the Sacrament of Penance. The individual rite is available in Holy Trinity church Banyo on Saturday afternoons 4-5pm. Two communal rites are being offered. Firstly, on Wednesday 14th at 7pm in Holy Trinity Church Banyo. Secondly, on Wednesday 21st at 7pm in Corpus Christi Church Nundah.

Collection in support of Ukraine. The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) has approved of an Advent Collection to support the work of Mudra Spava (Wise Action), a Patriarchal Charitable Foundation in Ukraine. Our bishops are asking Australian Catholics to "support refugees and people in Ukraine during this winter, which will be the most challenging for our country for decades of independence." (Bishop Mykola Bychok CSsR). If you would like to make a donation place it in an envelope marked 'Ukraine' and place it on one of the collection plates at Mass or hand it in to the parish office.

Advent Adventures. Our Parish Sacramental Coordinator, Angela Greathead, is holding a day on Thursday of this week for parish children. The purpose of the day is to help children, through activities, experience and understand the meaning of Christmas. 
