Something to Think About

God chose Mary, a simple young woman, to be the mother of God. Can you imagine how Mary must have felt to have been chosen for this special job?

The Story

This week's gospel tells the story of how Mary accepted God's invitation to be the mother of Jesus. Mary listened to God and believed in her heart, even though she did not understand everything that was happening to her. We also hear of how Joseph listened to God's instructions and did just as God asked of him in taking Mary to be his wife and in naming their son Jesus.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

1:18-24

This is how Jesus Christ was born.

A young woman named Mary was engaged to Joseph from King David's family. But before they were married, she learned that she was going to have a baby by God's Holy Spirit.

Joseph was a good man and did not want to embarrass Mary in front of everyone. So he decided to quietly call off the wedding.

While Joseph was thinking about this, an angel from the Lord came to him in a dream. The angel said, "Joseph, the baby that Mary will have is from the Holy Spirit. Go ahead and marry her. Then after her baby is born, name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

So God's promise came true, just as the prophet had said,

"A virgin will have a baby boy, and he will be called Immanuel," which means "God is with us."

After Joseph woke up, he and Mary were soon married, just as the Lord's angel had told him to do.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

PAPER NATIVITY FIGURES

You will need: a template for each child printed on construction paper, scissors, paddle-pop sticks, blu-tac or plasticine, scissors.


- 1. Cut out the shapes of Mary, Joseph, baby Jesus and the manger.
