The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

2:1-14

Emperor Augustus gave orders for the names of all the people to be listed in record books. These first records were made when Quirinius was governor of Syria.

Everyone had to go to their own hometown to be listed.

So Joseph had to leave Nazareth in Galilee and go to Bethlehem in Judea.

Long ago Bethlehem had been King David's hometown, and Joseph went there because he was from David's family.

Mary was engaged to Joseph and travelled with him to Bethlehem.

She was soon going to have a baby, and while they were there, she gave birth to her first-born Son. She dressed him in baby clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

That night in the fields near Bethlehem some shepherds were guarding their sheep.

All at once an angel came down to them from the Lord, and the brightness of the Lord's glory flashed around them. The shepherds were frightened.

But the angel said, "Don't be afraid!

I have good news for you, which will make everyone happy.

This very day in King David's hometown a Saviour was born for you.

He is Christ the Lord. You will know who he is, because you will find him dressed in baby clothes and lying in a manger."

Suddenly many other angels came down from heaven and joined in praising God.

Group Activity

Baby Jesus in a Manger


You will need:

Template for each child printed on cardboard, white cardboard, paints (blue, yellow, brown and skin colour), paper plates, paint brushes, black marker, glue stick, scissors, plastic forks

- 1) On the template, paint the circle in skin colour, and the oval shape in blue. (This will be the baby Jesus.)
- 2) Pour brown and yellow paint onto the paper plate. Then dip the underside of fork prongs into the brown paint. Starting in the centre of the white cardboard, drag the fork gently from the middle outwards. Keep going until the page is covered. Then repeat with the yellow paint. The combined colours will look like straw for baby Jesus to lay on.
- 3) Cut out the painted circle and oval. Glue the head to the body and use a black marker to draw on a face. Then glue the baby Jesus onto the manger.
