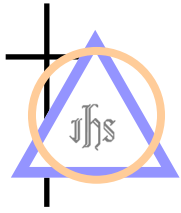


Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish

POPE EMERITUS, BENEDICT XVI

Joseph Ratzinger was born in Bavaria on 16 April 1927. He was ordained priest in 1951 and taught theology. He was ordained bishop for the Archdiocese of Munich and Freising in 1977 and was appointed cardinal the same year.

After only five years, he was appointed Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, a position he held until 2005 when he was elected pope, taking the name Benedict. During this time, he was also President of both the International Theological Commission and the Pontifical Biblical Commission. His powerful intellect shaped the direction of the Church and its priorities at the end of the 20th century and the beginning of the 21st.

From 19 April 2005 until his resignation on 28 February 2013, he was the pope, the Bishop of Rome. By this time his theology was generally focused on affirming the objective truths of the faith against what he saw as the relativism of Western society. He was the first pope to resign in 700 years and has since lived quietly in the Mater Ecclesiae Monastery within the Vatican.
