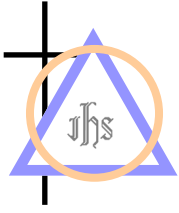


Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish

Dear Parishioners,

The news that George Cardinal Pell passed away in Rome after complications arose associated with a hip replacement surgery, came to my knowledge just minutes before I celebrated our 9:00am Wednesday Parish Mass in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo. I was saddened by the news. But, regrettably, there will be a good number of Australians (people who were either victims or friends and relatives of sexually abused children, or simply people who steadfastly believed that Cardinal Pell was guilty of sexual abuse even after The High Court of Australia unanimously quashed those very same convictions 7-0), who will be rejoicing after learning of his death. It seems to me that Cardinal Pell was a whipping boy being blamed by all and sundry for instances of sexual abuse that occurred beyond his personal jurisdiction as Archbishop of Melbourne and Sydney. The vitriol that he received from the general public and some media organisations as he arrived each day for his court hearings was atrocious. But he stoically bore the brunt of that abuse, much in the same way that Our Lord bore the abuse of the soldiers and onlookers as he carried his Cross to Calvary, and once there, to be nailed to it and to die. As a Cardinal, he rightly deserves our respect and admiration for his pastoral leadership and his orthodoxy to the Faith. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in eternal peace. Amen.

Thank you to the kind way that you welcomed me into this Parish at last weekend's Sunday Masses. So many of you gave me your names as you introduced yourselves to me, but honestly, it was a case of information overload; I will forget many of your names, so I apologise in advance for not remembering who all of you are. In time, I will come to identify many of you by your names and faces.

During my address to all who attended my four Sunday Masses, I shared a little about my family and my calling to the vocation of the priesthood. I also said that I would share with you more of my life story

across the coming weeks. I would like to begin by précising my priestly career:

8 December 2001 - Ordained Deacon, St Joseph's Church, Murgon. I served my diaconate period in the Kingaroy Nanango Parish, assisting Fr Pat Cassidy.
5 July 2002 - Ordained Priest, St Stephen's Cathedral, Brisbane. I was appointed as Priest-in-residence, Murgon Parish until 31 December 2002, whilst the Parish Priest was absent on sabbatical leave.
2003 - 2004 - Associate Pastor, Redcliffe City Parish, assisting Fr Peter Gillam.
2004 - 2009 - Parish Priest, Murgon.
2010 - 2012 - Parish Priest, North Ipswich and Parish Administrator, Leichhardt.
2013 - 2015 - On Loan to Lismore Diocese, and served as Parish Administrator, Wauchope.
2016 - Hospital Chaplain to the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, Herston
2017 - 2022 - Parish Priest, Moorooka Salisbury.

My appointments and placements across 21 years (almost) of priestly service, many in rural settings, provide me with a breadth of priestly experience that I hope I will be able to use in my current appointment. I anticipate that this appointment will in all likelihood be my final one before my anticipated retirement in April, 2031. In the meantime, we all have a busy task ahead of us: preparing for the commemoration and celebration of the centenary of Corpus Christi Church, Nundah, in 2026. Please lend a hand in making this event a memorable one.
