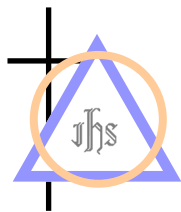


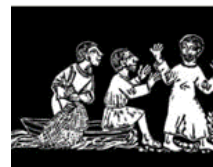
# Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish

## Acknowledgement of Country

We, the parishioners of the Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish, acknowledge the Turrbal People who are the Traditional Custodians of this land. We pay respect to the Elders past, present and future and extend that respect to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People.

Dear Parishioners,

I received a notification from the Archbishop last Wednesday afternoon (it came too late for last weekend's Newsletter so I held it over until this weekend) advising that he intended to visit our Parish from 17 March to 19 March 2023 inclusive (i.e. St Patrick's Day to St Joseph, Husband of Mary).

A Parish Pastoral Visit is a canonical requirement for the Local Ordinary (i.e. Archbishop) to conduct annually, either in whole or in part, so that he visits the entire diocese at least every five years either personally or, if he has been legitimately impeded, through the coadjutor Bishop, an auxiliary, Vicar General, episcopal Vicar, or another presbyter. A Pastoral Visit is one of the ways in which the Bishop maintains personal contact with the clergy and with other members of the people of God. It is an opportunity to rejuvenate the energies of those engaged in evangelisation, and to praise, encourage and reassure them, and to invite the faithful to a renewal of Christian life and to an ever more intense apostolic activity.

During a normal Parish Pastoral Visit, the Bishop would:

- celebrate Mass and preach the Word of God;
- meet the pastor and other clerics who assist in the Parish;
- meet with the parish pastoral council (PPC) and with the associations of the faithful;
- meet with the parish finance council (PFC);
- meet with children, youth and young adults who are receiving catechetical instruction;
- visit the school and other Catholic institutions dependent on the parish; and,
- visit some of the sick of the parish, insofar as it is possible.

At the Archbishop's own suggestion, he will formally install me as Parish Priest during the Saturday 6:00pm Vigil Mass (18 March) in the Corpus Christi Church, Nundah. The Archbishop is using this Parish Pastoral Visit for my installation rather than return again to the Parish subsequently (or even prior to his Visit) to install me as your Pastor; you might say that it is a little like 'Killing two birds with one stone,' as the proverb goes. In all probability, there would be a supper celebration with the Archbishop following my installation Mass in the adjacent Nolan Hall.

In the meantime, I will need to meet with the members of our pastoral council, finance council, liturgy committee, school communities, and associations of the faithful in due course to finalise a programme and those liturgies which will occur during the Archbishop's Pastoral Visit. You will be duly informed as his Visitation programme is firmed-up, and I look forward to your active and full participation in this important event.

Our Schools will recommence on Tuesday (January 24) after enjoying a long break and I look forward in anticipation to meeting their staff and students, and to begin, what I hope might be, a long alliance with them.

Thursday is a Public Holiday marking Australia Day, and of course, the Parish Office will be closed. I will be celebrating an Australia Day Mass at the earlier time of 9:00am in the Nundah Church; the 6:30pm Banyo Mass will be cancelled just for this week. My apologies for any inconvenience caused, but I feel that, since it is a Public Holiday, a 9:00am Mass would be most convenient for the majority of Parishioners.

May the week ahead be a joyful one for all of you. God bless!

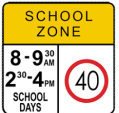
