Dear Parishioners,

Thank you to all who attended our Parish's Australia Day Mass on Thursday morning. There was a good sized congregation in attendance for a Public Holiday. I hope that you were all able to celebrate our National Day in the true Australian spirit.

We are less than a month away from the beginning of the Season of Lent. Ash Wednesday falls on February 22. Being new to this Parish, and needing to be au fait with what has been normal practices, I thought that I would give all Parishioners an early heads-up about our Parish Lenten and Easter celebrations; you can add the events into your diaries or wall calendars. They are:

Ash Wednesday, 22 February - Blessing and distribution of Ashes: There will be two services -9:00am, Holy Trinity Church, Banyo; 6:30pm, Corpus Christi Church, Nundah.

2nd Rite of Reconciliation, 22 March: 7:00pm, Corpus Christi Church, Nundah.

2nd Rite of Reconciliation, 29 March: 7:00pm, Holy Trinity Church, Banyo.

Palm Sunday, 1 & 2 April: Usual Sunday Mass times, however, the Blessing and Procession of Palms will only occur at the first Masses celebrated at each Mass Centre (i.e. 6:00pm Vigil, Nundah; 7:30am, Banyo).

Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, Holy Thursday, 6 April: 7:00pm, Holy Trinity Church, Banyo.

Stations of the Cross, Good Friday, 7 April: 10:00am, Holy Trinity Church, Banyo.

The Passion of the Lord, Good Friday, 7 April: 3:00pm, Corpus Christi Church, Nundah.

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, Holy Saturday, 8 April: 7:00pm, Corpus Christi Church, Nundah.

Easter Sunday, 9 April: 7:30am, Holy Trinity Church, Banyo; 9:30am, Corpus Christi Church, Nundah. NB: No 5:00pm Mass at Holy Trinity today (Easter Sunday).

Friends, the opening words of today's First Reading from the Prophet Zephaniah are: Seek the Lord ... Seek integrity, seek humility...' They complement the calm and warm aspirations that Jesus espouses in his Beatitudes. The Beatitudes provided solace and hope to the poor and downtrodden Jewish people who were present for his Sermon on the Mount. When Our Lord's are combined with Zephaniah's Beatitudes directions to seek the Lord, and also integrity and humility, and we apply them in our own lives, we move ever-closer to the fundamental ideals that the Lord desires for us as his disciples. Strive to be good in all things and always trust in Jesus.



they shall see God.





CATHOLIC LEADER DIGITAL PILOT PROJECT

Banyo/Nundah is one of 5 parishes taking part in a pilot of a new digital delivery model for The Catholic Leader.

What's happening?

- During the 3-month pilot The Catholic Leader will cease newspaper deliveries to the parish. Instead, there will be free access to the digital version of the Leader via a QR Code in the weekly parish bulletin.


