We, the parishioners of the Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish, acknowledge the Turrbal People who are the Traditional Custodians of this land. We pay respect to the Elders past, present and future and extend that respect to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People.

Dear Parishioners

Today, Sunday 5 February, within our Church is known as 'Word of God Sunday'. 'Word of God Sunday' was instituted by Pope Francis in September 2019, when issuing the apostolic letter *Aperuit Illis*. The letter encouraged the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God. The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference suggest a number of different ways to entrench a love of Holy Scripture in one's life and they are by establishing a Bible study group within the Parish or Mass Centre communities, and/or the adoption of *lectio divina*, a common practice of reflection on Holy Scripture.

The Queensland Government has relaxed all the COVID-19 restrictions that were originally introduced to stem or control the spread of the virus. The restrictions that have been relaxed pertain to spatial distances that people needed to observe (e.g. 1.5m separation between one another, our ability to dine out without the need for registration, and so on). I therefore believe that there is negligible need for those spatial precautions that were instigated for those coming forward to receive Holy Communion to still be enforced in our Masses. Consequently, I have decided that at all Corpus Christi, Nundah Masses, Communicants who sit in the nave of the church come up to Communion via the centre aisle and return via the side aisles (adjacent to the walls). Those who are located in the transepts of the church should come forward to receive Holy Communion first; the people sitting in the nave would then follow-on. This is nothing more than the resumption of the pre-COVID Communion methodology, and it applies solely to Corpus Christi; the Holy Communion practices for the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, shall continue as is.

Friends, I have been informed that Fr Bernie Gallagher had appealed to all Parishioners who have a deep interest in tending the gardens of the Corpus Christi Church, to consider coming forward and assuming responsibility for the care and maintenance of that church's gardens and hedges. Previously, these areas were lovingly tended to by Joe and Beth Ryan, who have since moved away from the Parish. I have also been informed that no one came forward to volunteer themselves on that occasion. I want to ask once again whether there might be one or more Parishioners who

might care to take on the responsibility for the care of Corpus Christi gardens and walkways. Please either speak directly to me or call the Parish Secretary, Debra, if you can help. The gardens and external environs are something that truly distinguishes this church from other churches and they certainly complement the architecture of the church too. So, if the Parish does not hear back from any interested persons by Friday, 17 February, I will begin with gardening negotiations and contractors for their tending to the gardens, etc. So, if you are keen to help, and would like to keep the Parish expenses to a minimum, please contact the Parish Office. Thank you. I would like the external environs of both Parish churches to be in good order for the Archbishop's March 17-19 Parish Pastoral Visit.

Friends, it is also with an element of sadness that I report the retirements of the Chairpersons of both the Parish Pastoral (PPC) and Parish Finance Councils (PFC). Christine Lloyd has only served two years as a Parish Pastoral Councillor, but she is retiring because of ill-health. Her service to the Parish as the Chair of the PPC may have been short in duration, but has nevertheless been important. Equally, I note that Lindsay Stokes has served as PFC Chair for some 14+ years, and what I find absolutely amazing is that Lindsay has been living at Mitchelton for the majority of that time but has continued to serve this Parish. On behalf of all Parishioners, I sincerely thank them both for their valuable service to the Parish. In accepting their resignations, the PPC and PFC met independently Thursday, 2 February, to elect replacement Chairpersons, and I am pleased to announce that Simon McLean was elected to serve as PPC Chair (NB: previously Simon has been serving as PPC Minute Secretary, and his vacated former role has now been taken over by Damien Dwyer), and Doug Desouza was elected in absentia (he will have the opportunity to accept or decline this position after returning from his short holiday) to serve as PFC Chair. Please provide Simon and Doug with every support. Again, the election of replacement Council Chairs in advance of the Archbishop's pending Parish Pastoral Visit is absolutely essential.

Once again, may I offer prayerful blessings for each of you throughout the week ahead.







CATHOLIC LEADER PILOT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Will the Newsroom work with all devices?

Yes, it is hosted on a webpage on The Catholic Leader website and is accessible by any device that has access to the Internet.

Do I need to register for Your Catholic Newsroom?

No, the Newsroom is available to anyone who has the link to it, either directly: www.catholicleader.com/newsroom or who uses the QR code.

Is this a free service? Will it remain free? Yes, it is free and will remain free.

How long will this pilot last? The pilot for the Newsroom will last three months. At the end of the three months, The Catholic Leader will assess the success of the pilot and make a decision on the future of the project.

Can I still access a print newspaper? Anyone can access a print newspaper by subscribing online at https://catholicleader.com.au/ subscribe/, by phone (07) 3324 3555, or by visiting a parish or location stocking The Catholic Leader newspaper.

Does this mean the print newspaper is not coming back?

The Catholic Leader team is looking at new ways to deliver our news as the cost to produce print newspapers continues to increase. There is no plan to remove the print newspaper in 2023.

I am not computer literate or I do not have access to an Internetconnected device, how can I access the Newsroom?

Your Catholic Newsroom requires access to an Internet-connected device. Unfortunately The Catholic Leader does not have devices to give out to people in this situation but you might be able to talk to friends, family or parish members who can show you on a device of their own.

How often will Your Catholic Newsroom update its stories? Your Catholic Newsroom will update its stories by 6pm each Friday.

My eyesight is not good enough to read text on the web, what can I do? When you open a story on Your Catholic Newsroom (or any story on The Catholic Leader website), you will be able to increase the size of the text in the story. A small button of AA under the headline can be clicked, and then you can increase the text by clicking the larger A.

Am I missing out on content by not receiving the newspaper in the parish? There are pieces of content that appear in the newspaper that will not be made available online. All major newspaper stories will be available either in Your Catholic Newsroom or on The Catholic Leader website. These stories might appear later or earlier than they appear in the print newspaper, there is no general rule.

Can I still access the crosswords?

The crosswords and games are not available online. You will need access either to The Catholic Leader print edition or its digital flipbook to access the crosswords and games.

How can I give my feedback to The Catholic Leader team about Your Catholic Newsroom?
