Acknowledgement of Country

Dear Parishioners,

A reminder firstly, that Ash Wednesday occurs this week. There will be two Ash Wednesday Masses, the first beginning at 9:00am in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo; the second, beginning at 6:30pm in the Corpus Christi Church, Nundah. Blessing and distribution of ashes will occur at both Masses. Come along, it is the best way to start your Lenten journey.

Then, on Saturday, 25 February, from 8:00am, our Working Bee to relocate the Altar, Ambo, Presider's Chair and Lectern, and return pews will occur. All volunteers for this Working Bee should call and leave their particulars with the Parish Secretary, before noon on Friday, 24 February. Thank you.

Given my professional qualifications in the building and construction industry, I have undertaken an investigation of the extent of the restoration and repair works that were previously identified in the Conservation Management Plan commissioned by Father Paul Chandler and completed in 2014, for our Corpus Christi Church. The restoration and repair works are both expensive and extensive, and are also necessary.

Thankfully, our Insurer, Catholic Church Insurance (CCI) has acknowledged the validity of the Parish's claim for storm damage repairs to the copper sheeted dome, so that is one element that the Parish will not have to fund. I've been informed that those storm damage repairs are anticipated to equal or even exceed 2.5M - 1.5M of the expense will be tied up in providing engineer-designed purpose built scaffolding.

The remaining elements of repairs and maintenance requiring attention are our sole responsibility to finance. The Parish, in Father Bernie's time, did procure quotations for much of this necessary maintenance, but the currency of those quotations has lapsed, and therefore, can only be used for indicative purposes only. The real cost will have risen considerably, because currently in the building industry, material and labour costs have skyrocketed significantly. I have summarised these elements, together with their out-of-date quotes, and a more recent estimate of their individual costs.

- Underpinning the northern transept wall (carpark-side): No quotation procured, say \$200,000 now.
- Repair Bage Street brick fence it is toppling over: build force \$128,348, say \$250,000 now.
- Remove, repair and replace 24 leadlight panels below the dome: Brisbane Leadlight Service \$36,864, say \$40,000 now.
- Remove, repair and replace 53 leadlight panels around the perimeter of the building: Brisbane Leadlight Service \$179,408, say \$190,000 now.

- Internal & external repainting: General Painting & Decorating \$152,839, say \$165,000 now.
- Replace termite effected flooring, joists and bearers in northern transept zone: No quotation procured, say \$60,000 now.
- Replace air conditioner units: No quotation procured, say \$150,000 now.
- Restore artwork to the 14 Stations of the Cross and to the 'Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament by the Nations' painting: No quotation procured, say \$40,000 now.
- Electrical and lighting upgrade internal and external : No quotation procured, say \$100,000.

The combined estimated cost of these works is \$1,195,000, say, \$1.2M rounded-up.

Given the overwhelming support by Parishioners for the retention of former church furniture arrangements, I am confident that Parishioners would be keen to financially assist with the affray of costs so that our Parish remains on a sound financial footing. I, like you, desire that the original character of Corpus Christi Church be retained, but it comes at a cost. So I now propose the following: **That the Banyo Nundah Catholic Parish strive to fundraise \$1.0M towards the costs of the repairs, restorations and upgrades to the Corpus Christi Church.**

The Parish has an existing Church Restoration Account which Father Bernie was slowly accumulating; this Account has a current balance of \$130,830. I therefore further propose: That Parishioners be invited to financially support by donating funds into the Parish's Church Restoration Account for the express purpose of offsetting the repairs and restoration expenses associated with the repairs, restoration and upgrades of Corpus Christi Church in readiness for the Church's Centenary Anniversary in 2026. By necessity, the focus right now does need to be given to the restoration of the Corpus Christi Church since it is rapidly approaching its centenary. Once this goal and these repairs and restorations are achieved, I propose to shift our focus over to The Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, and bring that facility up to a similar standard as the Corpus Christi Church (i.e. air conditioning, internal and external repainting, electrical and lighting upgrades, replacement of carpet floorcoverings, etc.). In my opinion, these upgrades to Holy Trinity Church are well and truly overdue and warranted.

The overall project demands our full and active participation; I hope and pray that all Parishioners will contribute.

May the week ahead be a blessed one for all of us, and may your Lenten journey be a prayerful one. God bless!
