Dear Parishioners.

It was a pleasant surprise for me to see so many Parishioners gather for our two Ash Wednesday Masses. I haven't personally had so many people attend Ash Wednesday Masses in any other Parish that I have served in. I should perhaps add, that I oughtn't be surprised by the attendance, particularly for the 6:30pm Nundah Mass, because I have already recognised in the brief few weeks that I have been here as your Parish Priest, the depth of your various talents by the variety of Parish Ministries in which you serve, and more importantly, the depth of your faith. It is my prayer for all of us, myself included, that our 2023 Lenten journey might be one where we genuinely take stock of our lives in what we do or neglect to do, and how we might earnestly desire to draw ever closer to the Lord through the reception of the Sacraments (Eucharist and Penance in particular), and through works of penance and charity. If we can achieve these things both at an individual and Parish community level, the Lord will look kindly on us and bless us. Let us commit ourselves to at least try.

Penance pays a significant part in everyone's Lenten journey, and to this end, I would remind all Parishioners of the options that this Parish is offering you during this Season of Lent. Firstly, there are the hourly weekly Confession sessions that occur every Saturday afternoon in Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, commencing from 4:00pm. Secondly, there will be two Second Rite of Reconciliation services conducted by me, one per Mass Centre, on the following dates: Wednesday, 22 March – Corpus Christi, Nundah; Wednesday 29 March – Holy Trinity, Banyo. Both services will commence promptly at 7:00pm. The third option I offer is for those who cannot avail themselves to either a Saturday Confession session or to a Second Rite service, is to make an appointment with myself for your Confession to be heard; the time (during Parish Office Hours only) will have to be mutually convenient for both parties – the Confessee and the Confessor.

A few pastoral notes concerning Lent that might also be of interest to you:

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year. The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year.
- Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others (e.g. By supporting Caritas Australia's **Project Compassion**). In this way, the whole Church prepares for Easter with those who ae to be baptised. Other celebrations in Lent (e.g. marriage) must take account of the spirit of

- penance. Musical instruments should only be used to sustain singing, and floral decorations should be very simple in design and arrangements.
- 4 Australian Catholics are obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday.

The Corpus Christi Church Working Bee to replace church pews and the Sanctuary furniture happened yesterday (Saturday). Given that I am preparing my Newsletter Message prior to the weekend itself, I can't actually comment on how well things flowed, that it was incident and injury free, or how many volunteers participated. What I can do though, is to sincerely thank everyone who did participate in the Working Bee or helped to prepare for the Working Bee for their services to the Parish. It is deeply appreciated by me. Thank you very much!

A landmark may have passed your attention during the past week, and that is that the war, that is still raging in Ukraine, has had its first anniversary. Hostilities began on 23 February 2022 when Russian forces invaded Ukraine in what was designed to be a lightning raid to quickly overwhelm the Ukrainian defences and to take possession of a Country which Russians genuinely believe is sovereign Russian territory. The Russian military planning was deeply flawed because they underestimated the veracity and the tenacity of the Ukrainian people. The war still continues. It is a David and Goliath-type battle. I sincerely thank you for joining me in praying to the Blessed Virgin Mary (i.e. the three Hail Mary's at every Parish Mass that I celebrate) for her intercession to bring about the end of this terrible and destructive war, so that peace might prevail.

Thank you also for your favourable reception to my announcement of a capital campaign to raise a \$1M across a 3-year timeframe to meet the majority of the expenses that will be incurred by the Parish in completing the restoration and essential repair works recommended for the Corpus Christi Church, Nundah. I quantified the majority of these works in last weekend's Parish Newsletter. I'll try not to harp on about this fundraising campaign with you too often, but what I have arranged is for a promo to be included within each edition of the Parish Newsletter which invites your participation as a contributing donor to the fundraising campaign and which also provides information that you would need on how you can contribute. The promo will also have a reporting mechanism in which the current quantum of contributions received in this campaign can be monitored by everyone. Keep your eye out for the promo each week and monitor our campaign's progress.

A final observation: the annual **Project Compassion** Campaign is now in operation. If you have not collected a set of envelopes for your household yet, a small number of these envelopes are still available for collection; you will find these near the main entrances to both Parish churches.

May $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$ bless you and your endeavours in the week ahead.



We begin our annual Lenten Project Compassion journey by learning about Laxmi, a 16-year-old girl living in Jajarkot, a remote district in Nepal where almost half of the population live below the poverty line. Tragedy struck when Laxmi was 10 years old and her father passed away. Her father worked hard to pay for his children's education and, after losing him, Laxmi was at risk of falling further into extreme poverty.

With the support of our partner Caritas Nepal, Laxmi joined a child's club at her school where she was encouraged to resume her education. Through the child's club, Laxmi developed the skills and confidence to become a leader, advocating for clean water taps at her school.

Laxmi is now excelling in her studies and working towards her dream of becoming a civil engineer. She continues to be involved in the child's club, serving as an advisor and mentoring the next generation of young leaders at her old school.
