Dear Parishioners,

Further to my report in last weekend's Newsletter, I can add the following comments. Firstly, the Working Bee was very well attended, I registered 20 male and female volunteers on the day. We started at 8:00am and had the majority of the work completed by 10:30am. A handful of us were remained until 1:00pm; this smaller group were engaged in bolting the kneelers to the pews, and securing the pews and modesty panels to the church floor. The Working Bee went really well and from a workplace, health and safety perspective, no one sustained or reported any personal injuries. Again, I sincerely thank those 20 volunteers for their help.

Today's Readings are only very short passages. The longest being Matthew's account of the Transfiguration. A brief commentary on the First Reading and Gospel for your edification.

> Like the story of Jesus' Baptism in the River Jordon, the Transfiguration of Jesus is also an epiphany story. Both stories are manifestations of Jesus as he is, or as he will be. In both stories there is a Voice, and the Voice says the same words. The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain, and a mountain was a place of divine manifestation (think of Abraham and Moses and even some Prophets and their encounters with God).. The Cloud is also a sign of the presence of God (think of the Exodus story). And the two figures who appear and speak with Jesus, Moses and Elijah, they stand for the Law and the Prophets.

> It is no longer possible to say what happened on the mountain. Was it a vision? Was it a profound experience? There has been a tendency to see the Transfiguration simply as a stage in the education of the Apostles. But the first and chief experience of the Transfiguration was for Jesus himself. It was

meant to confirm him in the course that he had taken.

But, of course, it also benefited the Apostles, Peter, James and John. And it is this that Matthew emphasises. For it is in the transfigured Jesus that they get a glimpse of the glory of the risen Lord. Even so, they would not fully understand this until Jesus had risen from the dead.

In the First Reading, we see the obedience of Abraham, our Father in Faith, an obedience which brought blessings to many. It also points to the obedience of Jesus (an obedience that took him to death on a cross), ad to the blessings that would flow to the world as a result.

Our Parish launch of the annual **Project Compassion** Campaign was a very low key one; there were so many competing interests occurring within the parish at the time. So, I thought that I should remedy that a little right now, whilst I have some available space and time. **Project Compassion** is a missionary outreach of Caritas Australia. This Organisation reaches out and helps needy communities around the world in positive ways. It might be to provide clean drinking water to a remote community in an African or South-East Asian country, something that we take for granted but for those communities, it can be lifesaving or most certainly, life-changing. Caritas Australia provides inspirational vignettes about how a donation of \$25, or \$50, or \$100 can make a real difference in peoples' lives. And it is how we respond to these vignettes that makes a difference. I've how Caritas Australia's noticed, too, Project Compassion envelopes evolvina with are technology. Their envelopes now sport QR codes that direct you straight to their Organisation so that they can receive and put your donations to work in their charitable ventures even more quickly. So, I heartedly recommend each household support the ongoing work of Caritas Australia by giving generously to their annual **Project Compassion** Appeal.

Second Week of Lent

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Tereesa, a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Through Baabayn, Tereesa was also able to hear stories from Indigenous Elders and reconnect with her culture.

Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community. Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.
