Dear Parishioners,

We are progressing nicely through Lent, but our Parish activities will begin to intensify very shortly as we begin to celebrate our Second Rite Reconciliations services (March 22 and 29), hosting the Archbishop during his Parish Pastoral Visit which includes my formal installation as your Parish Priest (March 31 & April 1), and then onto Holy Week and our Easter celebrations. Many of you will be involved in most, if not all, of these Parish events and celebrations. I thank God for the short reprieve that the Parish received from the Archbishop in delaying his Pastoral Visit (which was originally scheduled to commence from this Friday, 18 March (St Patrick's Day) and conclude on Sunday, 19 March, because we aren't quite ready for him, but we will be by March 31. Thank you, in advance, for your participation and assistance with these events.

As I have already alluded to, this Friday is St Patrick's Day. It is a Solemnity Feast Day in Australia since St Patrick is also one of our country's Patronal Saints. The Parish Mass will be at the regular Friday Weekday Mass time - Corpus Christi Church, 9:00am.

Ordinarily, the Feast of St Joseph, Husband of Mary, another Solemnity Feast, is celebrated on 19 March. However, the Feast Day has been relocated to 20 March, the first available day after the Fourth Sunday of Lent. The Sundays in Lent always take precedence over Feasts and Solemnity Feasts, hence the relocation this year to Monday, 20 March. The Parish Mass will be at the regular Monday Weekday Mass Corpus Christi 7:00am. Unfortunately, this Mass time is too early for representatives of the three Catholic Schools of our Parish to attend, so, as I understand, our Schools are celebrating para-liturgies to commemorate Joseph. All three Schools were founded by St Mary of the Cross' religious Order, the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heats (RSJ's), so the celebration of this particular Feast Day is very important to each of our Parish School communities.

There was a development that caught the Parish out at last Sunday morning's 9:30am Mass. I have been informed that the 9:30am Sunday Mass on the first Sunday of the Month is a Youth Mass with a Children's Liturgy component. However, just prior to the commencement of Mass, I was told that the Children's Liturgy Coordinator had retired from the position, and therefore, in the absence of a replacement Children's Liturgy Coordinator, the Children's Liturgy could not proceed. As Parishioners would be aware. Safequarding of children is a priority both this Parish and the Archdiocese. Consequently, without having a fully approved and accredited Coordinator (i.e. Queensland Blue Card, National Police Check, and recorded as a Volunteer), the Parish will be unable to resume Children's Liturgy until we have a replacement Coordinator installed and accredited. Also, the 2-adult rule must also apply, so a second adult must also be equally accredited to assist the Children's Liturgy Coordinator. So, I'm now calling for a volunteer to replace the outgoing Children Liturgy Coordinator, Pat Corfield. My thanks to Pat for her years of service to Banyo Nundah Parish as a Children's Liturgy Coordinator to the Corpus Christi Church.

I am happy to announce that our Parish has entered into a Parish Newsletter sponsorship agreement with Holy Cross Funerals. Holy Cross Funerals is owned and operated by Redcliffe City Parish and it offers a first class funeral service at very economical rates. You will begin to see their advertising banner on the bottom of our Parish Newsletter's front page very soon. Once again I do hope and pray that the week ahead is a blessed one for each of you and your families.



Third Week of Lent

We are now in the third week of Lent with the Project Compassion story of Priscilla, who lives in the Hwange district in Zimbabwe with her husband, Charles, and two of their grandchildren. Climate change continues to bring unprecedented challenges for people living in the most vulnerable and remote communities in Zimbabwe.

During times of intense drought and food shortages, Priscilla had to commute to the town centre and wait in long gueues to collect food.

With the support of Caritas Hwange, Priscilla learnt conservation farming skills to grow drought-resistant crops and started poultry farming to support her family during the current food crisis. Priscilla was able to produce a bumper harvest in her first year of practising in conservation farming. Priscilla also used the funds from her harvest to start poultry farming, which enabled her to sell eggs to pay for her grandchildren's school fees, books and stationery. The poultry farming provides a safety net for Priscilla and her family during times of hardship, like the current drought.

While the situation in Zimbabwe and across eastern Africa remains dire, the work of Caritas Hwange means that Priscilla can learn the techniques, tools and resources she needs to build resilience and support her family during this current food crisis.
