Pentecost Sunday — 28th May 2023 — Year A

Dear Parishioners,

Today, Pentecost Sunday, is the birthday anniversary of the Church. So, Happy Birthday to all brothers and sisters in Christ!

We have, during all Sunday Masses, a Presentation of the Apostles' Creed to all Confirmation candidates before they, and the entire assembly recite the prayer. I do beg your indulgence and patience whilst the presentation takes place.

Our 5:00pm Sunday Mass today is a 'Family Mass'. But given that all Masses are in effect family Masses because our Masses are open to all, today's 'Family Mass' is differentiated in that our local Parish Primary School of St Pius V will be hosting a sausage sizzle supper after Mass, and that during Mass, children from that school will be undertaking various ministerial roles. The monthly 'Family Mass' is an initiative of the St Pius V Primary School which I heartily endorse and look forward to welcoming their community back to more of these Masses during 2023 and beyond. In this regard, I thank Mr Peter Gordon, Principal and his staff for their continued support.

Today's Homily is the final in a series of seven homilies prepared by Auxiliary Bishop Ken Howell that have as their primary focus, the **seven Apostolic Priorities** identified by Archbishop Mark Coleridge. I have mounted posters of the seven Priorities for Parishioners benefit on the walls (Nundah) and windows (Banyo); I hope that Parishioners might avail themselves of the opportunity to refresh their memories and the rationales of these Priorities. I reported back during last Sunday's Masses on my attendance along with four other Parishioners at the Archdiocesan **Summit 23** event where the seven Priorities were discussed. They will then be discussed in even more detail in the **Archdiocesan Synod** which the Archbishop has called for 2024 – I don't have any scheduling details pertaining to the Archdiocesan Synod at this point, but when that information comes to hand, I will pass that information along.

Speaking of Bishop Ken Howell, the news filtered through late Wednesday afternoon from the Archbishop that Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Ken to be the 7th Bishop of Toowoomba, succeeding Bishop Robert McGuckin. His Episcopal Installation Mass will be in St Patrick's Cathedral, Toowoomba on July 11. Please remember Bishop Ken in your prayers.

During the coming week, the Church celebrates two Marian Feast Days to complete the Marian month of May. The two Feasts are **The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church**, on Monday 29 May, and **The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, on Wednesday 31 May. All Parishioners are invited to these respective Masses.

Then, next Sunday (3 & 4 June) is the Patronal Feast Day of our Banyo church: **The Most Holy Trinity**. This would mark the beginning of the eight-day Parish celebration that has been colloquially known within this Parish as the 'Feastival'. The 'Feastival' concludes with the following weekend (10 & 11 June) when we celebrate the second Patronal Feast of **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ** of our Nundah Church (i.e. Corpus Christi).

CORPUS CHRISTI 2023

Are you proud of your Catholic faith? Are you looking for an opportunity to bear witness and help "make disciples of all nations" (Matt 28:19)?

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 11, join with over 4000 other Catholics making a public testimony of faith by walking in a Eucharistic procession through the streets of Brisbane city. It will be a colourful display as groups gather from all across the Archdiocese of Brisbane to represent their parish or cultural community.

The Corpus Christi Procession will start and end at the Cathedral of St Stephen and feature prayers, rosary, hymns and Benediction with proceedings led by Archbishop Mark Coleridge.

The weekend will also feature a Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition (10th - 11th June in the Cathedral precinct's Francis Rush Centre) and a vigil night of adoration (10th June from 7pm 11th June 8am, in the Mary MacKillop Chapel).

For your information, our Parish has been very busy in a number of areas (e.g. Parish Pastoral Visit by the Archbishop; my Installation as your Parish Priest; completion of two Archdiocesan Audits – Safeguarding and Workplace, Health and Safety; the commencement of our Parish Confirmation Sacramental Program), and of course, there is also the reality of my own coming to grips with my new role as your Parish Priest, such that the planning and preparations for the 2023 **Feastival** celebrations has really gotten under my guard. Thankfully, the members of the parish Liturgy Committee have been on the ball and have organised some arrangements. This is what will occur in 2023. On the Feast of **The Holy Trinity at the 7:30am Mass (4 June)**, early in that Mass, Parishioners representing their various ethnicities will be invited to process copies of their original National Flags and place them before the Altar. Then, after Mass, the Care and Concern people will cook a breakfast for all to participate in. The following Sunday will be Nundah's turn to celebrate. To mark The Feast of **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**, the same liturgical action as for Banyo will be replicated: National Flags will be processed up and placed before the Altar during the **9:30am Mass (11 June)**. After that Mass, a morning tea will be served in the CCC area behind the church. Your Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) have endorsed these plans. Next year (2024), your PPC will be better prepared to celebrate our twin Feast Days that occur on consecutive Sundays, and I am optimistic that the Nundah church Feast Day celebrations will include a short public Corpus Christi street march beginning from and returning to Corpus Christi Church. **I would invite Parishioners of different nationalities to inform me or the Parish Secretary of what your nationalities might be so that we can prepare the appropriate flags for the processions.** Thank you!

I trust that the Holy Spirit, on the Solemnity Feast of Pentecost might fire-up our hearts and minds in the love of Christ and of his Holy People so that we might better serve one another; and may you all experience a joy filled week throughout the week ahead.
