The Transfiguration of the Lord — 6th August 2023 — Year A

Dear Parishioners,

I wrote this message on Thursday morning whilst I am convalescing from my recent surgery. I can't report (at this point) on my surgery because I don't return to see and speak to my surgeon until tomorrow morning. I can say though that my recovery has been relatively painless. Curiously, the most significant pain has been associated with my leg surgery. May I again thank you for your prayers and well wishes.

Once again, my thanks to our three visiting Priests and Deacon Kelemete Ta'ale for leading Masses and Eucharistic services during my sick leave, and also to our Parish Secretary, Debra Visser, for her dutiful service to you.

I also advised that Deacon Kelemete and I will be attending an Archdiocesan Convocation (a fancy name for a meeting) of Clergy on Wednesday and Thursday of this week, in last weekend's Newsletter message. Our absence will have a small impact on our Parish's liturgical celebrations in that I will be unable to celebrate our usual 9:00am Wednesday Mass at Banyo. Similarly, neither of us will be available to lead any other liturgical celebrations (e.g. funerals, anointing of the sick, etc.) during office hours on Wednesday and Thursday. I will, however, celebrate the 6:30pm Thursday Mass at Banyo. In addition, I will be celebrating a 9:00am Mass commemorating **the Solemnity Feast of St Mary of the Cross** on Tuesday, this Mass will be celebrated in the Nundah church; the congregation for this Mass will include the St Joseph's Primary School community.

Next Tuesday, August 15, is **the Solemnity Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (it is a Holy Day of Obligation)**, and I will be celebrating two Masses in the Parish. The first will be a 9:00am Mass in the Nundah church, the second will be a 6:30pm Mass in the Banyo church. According to our Church's tradition, It has infallibly and doctrinally declared that at the moment of her death, her body did not decay and that she was raised up (assumed), body and soul, into Heaven.

So, what does a Holy Day of Obligation mean to Catholics? It means that the Feast Day is elevated in importance by the Church to being equal to a Sunday Obligation to keep holy the Sabbath. As Catholics, we are duty-bound to attend Mass on all Holy Days of Obligation. So that Mass is accessible to as many Parishioners as possible, that is why I am offering the Parish two Masses next Tuesday.

It's great to be back with you again, and I pray that your week ahead will be a blessed one.

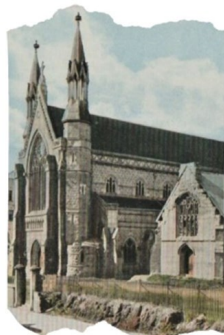


Cathedral of St Stephen Guides and Welcomers Celebrating 25 years on 27 August 2023
