The Epiphany of the Lord — 7th January 2024 — Year B

Dear Parishioners,

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. As we read in this weekend's Gospel, the three Magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar (AKA the three Wise Men) first paid homage to the Christ-Child that they found in so very humble surroundings before presenting their gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh.

In our recent Christmas Vigil and Day Gospel readings, the Christ-Child was presented to the Jewish world via the shepherds who hurried to see for themselves what it was that the Angels had proclaimed to them. Today, it is the turn of the Magi who followed a star to the place where '...the infant king of the Jews' (Mt 2:2) lay resting in a manger. The Magi represent the non-Jewish or Gentile world: us.

The Magi anticipated great things from the child that they had followed the star to visit; hence, their extravagant gifts, gifts truly worthy of a king.

Today, we present ourselves before the Christ-Child but we come bearing different gifts. Our gifts are varied and many. They may not match the magnanimity of the Magi's but they are gifts of much value nevertheless. They are our gifts of faith, loyalty and discipleship to Jesus Christ, our gifts of service and love to God and our neighbour, and our gifts of committing ourselves to sharing the Good News of our Lord and Saviour with the world.

The visit by the Magi could have tragically ended differently if they hadn't heeded the warning that came to them in their dreams that very night and instead had returned to deceitful and conniving King Herod and divulged where they had found the child for whom they had been searching. They listened to God and so should we, and when we do, our gifts become priceless in the sight of God.

I received an interesting and disturbing email from the Archdiocese on Wednesday. That email warned that scammers are employing a new tactic to dupe people of their wealth. The Church has become aware that the scammers are accessing Parish Newsletters to find the names, telephone numbers and email addresses of people who serve in Parish Ministries and they are using this information to enable them to contact those people, and to say that they were the Parish Priest and that they were in urgent need of financial assistance. Please be aware that no Catholic Priest in this Archdiocese would do this, so if you should receive an email from someone purporting to be me, know that it is a scam.

Responding to this scam *modus operandi*, I have authorised the removal of this personal information for everyone other than our Parish staff or our Parish School Principals, from our Newsletter commencing with this edition. In lieu, we now ask anyone who might have enquiries for WHS issues, or Eucharistic Adoration or Parish Computer Project or our Youth Activities to contact the Parish Office, and the Parish Office will pass along their enquiries to the relevant party if and when it is identified as being genuine. We do this in order to protect our Parishioners from harm.
