The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time — 14th January 2024 — Year B

Dear Parishioners.

Jesus offers us an invitation, an open invitation to 'Come and See.' For many of us who were baptised as infants, it was our parents who intervened for us and accepted his invitation by bringing us to the waters of Baptism. For all who were baptised as infants or young children, the work of becoming good disciples of Jesus Christ, did not stop at this point in our lives. It is continuous. It means that we have to apply ourselves humbly and willingly in his service. The first disciples certainly did, they came and saw and were so impressed with Jesus that they followed him closely for the next three years watching and learning all the while. Then, after his Ascension into Heaven, they and the other Apostles became the vanguard of the Christian Church.

This weekend, it is my honour on our Lord's behalf, to extend the same invitation to 'Come and See' to our three RCIA Candidates, Graham Mitchell, Heather Speechly and her son, Jayden Speechly-**Shagam**. In some ways, they each accepted this invitation when they commenced their RCIA journey towards joining our Church family. Today, during our 5:00pm Sunday Mass in the Holy Trinity Church, they will be invited to enrol their name in our Parish's Book of the Elect. The entry of their names is a clean and definitive demonstration of their intention to be faithful to our Lord and Saviour in all things. In entering their names, they transition to the next and final stage in their journey of preparation: the Church refers to this stage as being the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. This stage concludes with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Jayden will receive all three; Graham and Heather will receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and **Eucharist** because they have been baptised earlier in their lives.

It has been a great honour to journey alongside the three Candidates together with their Sponsors and Catechists. It is also very rewarding and I would highly recommend that if you have an opportunity to serve on a RCIA team either as a Sponsor or a Catechist, take it because that journey will deepen your faith and knowledge as a Catholic, and you will be rewarded by God in many ways, and one of those ways will be to receive His abundant Graces.

During the past week, I appointed Hendrik (Henri) Knol as the Parish's Youth Coordinator. Henri replaces Gysell Mortimer in this role and I sincerely thank Gysell for her services to the Youth Ministry. Some Parishioners may remember that Henri was sponsored in part by our Parish and spent the majority of last year in Christchurch, New Zealand, serving as a NET team member. He has offered his services and his NET Team experience to us and he is desirous of livening up the faith of our Parish Youth. He, together with Angela Greathead, our Parish Sacramental Coordinator, and a number of other Parish volunteers will help grow our Parish Pastoral Ministries to serve people.


Main Purpose
