# The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 28<sup>th</sup> January 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

Many of us will be enjoying a long weekend for various reasons. Perhaps one or more of the following suggested reasons might apply to you. It might be:

- that we are proud and patriotic Australia who take pride in their Australian citizenship and seek to celebrate our great Australian traditions with fellow Australians.
- that people who have migrated from other countries, where freedoms are either oppressed or openly discouraged, formally swear their allegiance to Australia in Citizenship Ceremonies.
- that you attend a family barbecue or a visit to the beach for a swim that have become a family tradition.
- that men or women who served in our country's defence forces, or relatives of deceased servicemen and women who fell on battlefields, proudly display the Australian flag that they fought and died under, to honour them.
- that a 3-day long weekend affords an individual or families to travel elsewhere.
- that some Australians will join in protests or campaign against public Australia Day celebrations on January 26 for ideological reasons.
- that cricket enthusiasts attend the Second Australia-West Indies Cricket Test Match at the Gabba.
- that Brisbane citizens attend some Brisbane City Council authorised Australia Day events in their vicinity.
- that you have to work across the weekend, then perhaps it might become just another weekend without any associated frivolity.

Whilst my hypothetical ways of celebrating or not celebrating Australia Day might apply to you, Australia Day in this millennia has become controversial. It seems that almost everyone has a view about its celebration at local, state and federal levels: has it become anachronistic to today's society and should it continue be celebrated at all; is January 26 (the date of Captain Phillip's and the First Fleets' arrival and his stepping ashore in Sydney Cove) still a suitable date for a national celebration; is it appropriate to call January 26 Invasion Day as many of our indigenous brothers and sisters currently do? I can't say. But for me, I take personal pride in calling Australia home, and on the few occasions in my life when I have travelled overseas, I truly do thank God that I was born in Australia on my return because Australia, even with her sweeping plains, her ragged mountain ranges, her droughts and flooding rains, hers far horizons, her jewel-sea, her beauty and her terror, as so aptly described by Doreathea Mackellar in her iconic poem, My Country, is the greatest country of all. I hope your 2024 Australia Day/ Long Weekend will be memorable whatever you choose to do.

In last weekend's Newsletter Message, I wrote about the relaxation of mandatory accreditation (Working with Children and Safeguarding training) by the Archdiocese for some Parish ministries (e.g. Readers, Eucharistic Ministers, Greeters/Welcomers). I can report that I had two immediate and positive responses from Banyo-based Parishioners, and I thank them very much for coming forward. I mention this more as a reminder that the offer is still there for Parishioners to consider because our Parish (at both Mass Centres) could certainly do with more people serving in these ministries. If, after considered thought, you feel that you too could serve in one or more of these capacities, I would invite you to speak with our Parish Manager, Debra, and she will help you with the next step.

#### How to mark yourself as unavailable for rostering

- Clicking the Change button will change you from Available to Unavailable which will show in red. Clicking Change again will change you back to Available.
- That's it! Try it out for yourself.
- The default is 'available', so please change it for times you know you're not available, for example school holidays/Easter. Many hands make light work.

I would ask that all existing Ministers of the Word and/or Eucharist reserve these dates and times in your diaries. Thank you!




On the 31st January at **7.15pm**, we are meeting to discuss our future goals whilst gaining a better understanding of the Archdiocese's plans. Emma
