The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time 4th February 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

Pope Francis established 'Word of God Sunday' as a means to celebrate, study and disseminate the Word of God more broadly in the lives of Catholics. The first celebration of 'Word of God Sunday' was last year (2023), and it falls annually on the first Sunday in the month of February. God's Word is to be found in *The Bible*, this is but one of the primary ways in which the faithful honour God's Word – by regularly reading the Word of God. Another way is by faithfully listening to the proclamation of the Readings as they are opened up in the homily. And yet another is to discern the various ways in which God's Word applies to a person's life and then doing something positive about what I was that the person has discerned. It is as I said during my homily last Sunday, 'Actions speak louder than words.'

During today's 9:30am Nundah Mass, I have invited Kristen Garrett, our St Joseph's Primary School Assistant Principal — Religious Education to briefly address the assembled congregation. Kristen along with Nadine Pike are our 2024 Coordinators for the Nundah Children's Liturgy. Kristen wishes to share her vision for this particular ministry and to call on families with young children to support Nadine and herself by entrusting to them the task of bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ in meaningful ways to their children. The Nundah Children's Liturgy will occur during the 9:30am Sunday Masses occurring on the Third Sunday of the Month (excluding school vacations). So, the very first Nundah Children's Liturgy will occur in a fortnight's time on Sunday, 18 February (the First Sunday of Lent).

For balance, I should also mention the Banyo Children's Liturgy which is coordinated by Colleen Bond and Bianca Besterwitch. These women have been leading the Children's Liturgy in 2023 and return to this ministry commencing from next Sunday's 5:00pm Mass, and I thank them for their dedicated service to our Parish. The Banyo Children's Liturgy occurs on the Second Sunday of the Month, again during School terms. A good number of young children have been attending this particular Liturgy and I would encourage families with young children to allow their children to attend these liturgies. Perhaps, families with young children might even consider allowing their children to attend both Parish Children's Liturgies at both Nundah and Banyo (they are on successive weekends), if they discover that their children are actually growing in the Faith via these liturgical encounters.

I will be celebrating an Opening School Mass for the St Pius V Primary School, Banyo, on Wednesday morning at 9:00am — it is the regular Wednesday weekday mass time, but for this week only, the venue will not be the Holy Trinity Church but the Multipurpose Hall of the School itself. The relocation is necessary because the large school community is beyond the capacity of the Holy Trinity Church. I do beg the indulgence of our regular Wednesday Mass attendees for the temporary inconvenience that this change in venue may cause.


A final reminder to all who are serving in the Ministries of Reader or Communion Minister or who either have recently nominated to serve in these ministries or haven't yet nominated themselves but would like to serve the People of God in one or both of these Ministries, I will be conducting brief training/refresher sessions in the Corpus Christi Church on Wednesday night (7 February). Separate short instructional courses will be offered for each Ministry these will last not more than 30 minutes each. The first session will begin at 6:30pm and that will be for those interested in or are serving as Ministers of the Word (i.e. Readers). The second session will commence at 7:15pm and that will be for those interested in or are serving as Ministers of Holy Communion. It is important that all current and future Ministers in these ministers do attend. Thank you!

The following Wednesday (February 14) is Ash Wednesday, and it marks the beginning of penitential season of Lent. I shall again offer a Mass in each Parish church to celebrate Ash Wednesday, and there will be the distribution of Ashes at both Masses. The first Mass will commence at 9:00am in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo. The second is at a more friendly time for workers who have commute or have an early start to their workday; this Mass will commence in the Corpus Christi Church, Nundah, at 6:00pm. Do try to attend a Mass on Ash Wednesday. Make this Lenten Season a meaningful one for yourself. Another useful way to deepen your Lenten observance this year is to participate either as a group or as an individual in a Lenten Prayer/Discussion Group. The Parish has promoted this year's Lenten Program 'A Resurrected Life - Daily Reflections for Lent', in recent Newsletters; the Program consists of short daily reflections beginning from Ash Wednesday and concluding on Easter Sunday. If you would like to participate in the Program, the Parish has procured a small quantity of these booklets and you can purchase your copy from the Parish Centre for \$6/ copy.

Our Parish Manager, Debra Visser, will be on vacation for the next two weeks; Debra will be visiting family members in Japan. I wish her bon voyage! During her absence, Marianne Davis will slide into her chair as Acting Parish Secretary.

May the Lord bless you and your endeavours throughout the week ahead .

Churchbox Quick Tips

How to mark yourself as unavailable for rostering

- From your dashboard, click on the Rotas drop-down box, then select "Your Availability"
- The current rotas will appear with two buttons, Available in green and Change in blue.
- Clicking the Change button will change you from Available to Unavailable which will show in red. Clicking Change again will change you back to Available.
- That's it! Try it out for yourself.
- The default is 'available', so please change it for times you know you're not available, for example school holidays/Easter. Many hands make light work.


