The Third Sunday of Lent 3 March 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

Our Parish's Second Rite of Reconciliation for this Season of Lent have been completed. For Parishioners seeking the celebration of the Sacrament, the Parish is offering just the First Rite option, and that is Individual Confession with Absolution, and the only standing times for this is the Saturday afternoon sessions in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, between 4:00pm and 5:00pm. It is possible for confessions to be heard in exceptional circumstances outside that regular advertised time, but it will only be offered on the understanding that it is convenient for me, and the confessions would be limited to times within normal Parish Office hours.

A piece of great news now for the Parish: our three RCIA Candidates will complete their extensive period of preparation during the coming week and they will be received joyfully into our Catholic Family next Sunday, 10 March, during our Parish's 9:30am Corpus Christi Mass. Please include Heather Speechly, her son, Jayden, and Graham Mitchell in your daily prayers as they begin the final week of their journey towards joining our Parish community as fully initiated Catholics. A word of warning for those who ordinarily attend the 9:30am Sunday Mass at Corpus Christi, the Mass will run a little longer because of these additional elements associated with the baptism and full initiation of the three Candidates; however, since the reception of these three Candidates is a Parish-wide celebration, I do hope that it will not dissuade you for attending and participating in this Mass. There will be a celebratory morning tea after this Mass in the adjacent Nolan Hall; I do hope also that you can find the time to stay on to congratulate Heather, Jayden and Graham. I offer my sincere gratitude to Norma Gomes, Elena Knol and Krissy Mitchell, their Sponsors, and to my Catechetical Team of Deacon Kelemete Ta'ale, Fred Gomes, Colina Knol and Susie O'Farrell, for participating in Heather, Jayden and Graham's journey.

In order to stage the Morning Tea successfully, the Parish would be looking for volunteers to assist with the catering, serving, and the setting-up and putting-way of chairs and tables in Nolan Hall. If you can assist, could I ask you to call our Parish Manager, Debra (3324 3870) to leave your name and details of how you might assist in this celebration. I apologise for the brevity of notice, but things have been quite hectic in the Parish of late, and I have overlooked coordinating and planning this proposed function any earlier. Thank you to all who volunteer to assist.

In today's Gospel (Jn 2:13-25), we read how Jesus cleansed the Temple in Jerusalem. He did so to '...stop turning my [his] Father's house into a market.' The Lord's zeal for the proper propriety of his Temple reminds me of another story that I read recently. I don't know where or when it actually occurred, but it apparently did. The incident involved someone anonymously writing a prayer over the lintel of a church door. This was that prayer:

Lord, make the door of this house wide enough to receive all who need human love and fellowship, narrow enough to shut out envy, pride and strife.

Make its threshold smooth enough to be no stumbling block to children, nor to straying feet.

Make this house a house of prayer and a gateway to your kingdom.

May this third week of Lent be a rewarding one for each of you. God bless!

Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.

Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water caused Leaia a lot of worry.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Leaia had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions.

"We are very thankful and grateful for the water tank. It has helped us so much and made our daily life easier," Leaia said.
