The Fifth Sunday of Lent 17 March 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

We are quickly moving to the end of this penitential Church season of Lent; we're now within the final fortnight. Our attention as disciples of Jesus Christ ought to, if it hasn't already occurred, be zeroing in on our spiritual selves. Have we availed ourselves of the Sacrament of Penance this Lent? Have our personal acts of penance and mortification during Lent moved us closer to the Lord? Well, I certainly hope that it has. But, if we have been lagging about getting out of the starting blocks this Lent, please consider doing something about it in this final fortnight; it will be something that I'm sure will be well worth the effort.

After much anticipation, and prayerful preparation, our neophytes, Heather Speechly and her son, Jayden, along with Graham Mitchell were received into our Church and Parish community last Sunday. It was a joyful occasion for all involved and I'm pleased that a good representation of our Parishioners were present to witness their reception into the Church. Their reception concluded with a celebratory morning tea in Nolan Hall. A good number of people adjourned to the Hall to partake of the morning tea, however, with the weather last Sunday being unsettled and showery, perhaps even more might have joined the trio's joyous moments. Again, I offer my heartfelt thanks to all who were involved in the RCIA process and in arranging or contributing to the success of the morning tea.

The Church in Australia celebrates two Solemnity Feasts this week: St Patrick, tomorrow Monday, 18 March, and St Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Tuesday, 19 March. The Parish will celebrate a Mass for each Feast; both will be in Corpus Christi Church. The Monday Mass will be at the usual time of 7:00am; the Tuesday Mass will be at the special time of 9:00am. St Patrick is a Co-Patron Saint of Australia, and St Joseph is widely venerated as a Patron of Artisans who honourably do good work with the gifts God has given them, and of Workers in general. To those who exercise the role of an adoptive parent, whether formally or informally, whether over one child or as the support of a whole family, he is a source of inspiration. All are most welcome.

Our Archdiocese celebrates its Annual Chrism Mass in the Cathedral of St Stephen on Thursday evening from 7:00pm. I, along with many of my brother Priests, will attend this Mass. It is an opportunity for each ordained minister to renew their Vows and their obedience to the Ordinary of the Archdiocese, Archbishop Mark Coleridge. Equally important is the creation of the Holy Oils to be used within the Archdiocese for our liturgies over the next twelve months. The Cathedral Parish have extended an open invitation to all Brisbane Archdiocesan Catholics to attend this special Mass; it would be nice to see some of our own Parishioners there too.

It is therefore obvious that, if I am attending the 7:00pm Chrism Mass on Thursday, and I can't bilocate, our regular 6:30pm Thursday night Mass in our Holy Trinity Church for this week will be a cancellation. For those who are regulars for this Mass, may I suggest that they attend a Mass in one of our neighbouring Parishes, or accept the Cathedral's invitation and attend their 7:00pm Chrism Mass.


Next Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. The first Sunday Mass at each of our Mass Centres will begin with the solemn entrance outside the front of each church with the blessing of palms and procession into the church. So, if it is your preference to attend either the 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass (Corpus Christi Church) or 7:30am Sunday Mass (Holy Trinity Church), I would ask you to assemble outside the respective churches before the blessing of palms and to join the procession into the church proper. Our other two Sunday Masses will include a blessing of palms during those Masses. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of the holiest of weeks in the Church's annual calendar. There are always conflicting interests for many Catholics when it comes to observing the Easter Triduum (e.g. attending NRL, AFL matches, and the like, or watching them on television), but for devout Catholics, their attendance and participation in their Parish's Easter Triduum (i.e. the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord, and the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night) is a priority and takes precedence over everything else.

May the Lord shower you with his blessings throughout the week ahead.


