Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord 31 March 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

'You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: He has risen, He is not here.' These are the tumultuous words of the Angel to Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, when they arrived at Our Lord's tomb, only to find it empty. They were momentarily in despair, but their despair quickly turned to elation as the full meaning of the Angel's words sank in. They now knew that Jesus had been Resurrected, thus fulfilling His prophecy, that He (Jesus) would rebuild the Temple (being his body) within three days. Jesus' Resurrection from the dead conquered, once and for all time, sin and death. We, His disciples, and indeed, all humanity who ever live are the beneficiaries of His salvific action. We are forever indebted to Him.

Christ completed the mission that His Heavenly Father assigned to Him with His Resurrection. Where He has ascended to, we, too, are now able to follow. That is the significance of Easter, and it makes the past seven weeks of our individual Lenten journeys, during which we have been preparing ourselves through acts of penance, charity, fasting and abstinence, all worthwhile. It is most likely, that we all encountered temptations during our journeys to quit — to give up, because it all has become too difficult. But, if you were able to overcome those temptations, that effort exerted to soldier on and to persevere, would have helped you to spiritually deepen your Lenten journey and draw ever closer to Jesus. God will reward you with his sanctifying Graces for your perseverance. And that, in my view at least, makes our Christian discipleship all the more worthwhile.

Where to after Easter? you may well ask. Well, for our Parish of Banyo Nundah, there is quite a lot of activity that we can choose to participate in, for example, our Parish Confirmation journey for our Year 3 school children concluding on 31 May; our second Parish RCIA program which will commence around mid-April (incidentally, I am looking out for four Parishioners to serve as Sponsors to our four Candidates); our Parish's own Corpus Christi Street Procession on 2 June after our 9:30am Sunday Mass; and our Annual week-long Feastival celebration running from Holy Trinity Sunday to Corpus Christi. That's just four items that are high on my radar, but there are many more activities that the Parish will be offering too. So, please join in

I would remind you that schools are again in recess for their mid-term vacation, so please proceed carefully when driving anywhere during this period; and also, that tomorrow's Easter Monday Mass is a cancellation in our Parish.

Next Sunday is the Second Sunday of Easter – Divine Mercy Sunday, and the Monday that follows, 8 April, is the Solemnity Feast of The Annunciation of the Lord. You may well ask why The Annunciation of the Lord, which usually occurs on 25 March is being delayed this year until 8 April? The answer is simple: whenever 25 March falls within Holy Week (as it does this year), it is deferred until the Monday of the Second Week of Easter – 8 April.

Finally, may I wish you all a Happy Easter. God bless! Fr Dan, Parish Priest
