The Fifth Sunday of Easter 28 April 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

The Church has been presented with a number of metaphors in recent weeks, given to us by Jesus Christ himself, to describe His mission. On the Third Tuesday of Easter, Jesus described himself as **the Bread of Life** — 'he who comes to me will never be hungry, and who ever believes in me will never be thirsty.' (Jn 6:35) This same metaphor — the Bread of Life — was repeated again on the Third Wednesday and Thursday of Easter (Jn 6:35 and Jn 6:48 respectively). The Church repeats this metaphor to emphasise that everyone needs Christ in our lives, equally, we need to feed upon him both in the literal sense — by bringing his Word and actions to life in ourselves, and in the food sense, Holy Communion — with his life-giving Body and Blood sustaining us until the Christian community comes together again to be fed again.

Then last Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, Jesus identified himself as **the Good Shepherd** – caring for his flock even to the extent that he would sacrifice himself for his flock. (Jn 10:14-15) Last Monday the Fourth Monday of Easter, Jesus identified himself as **the gate of the sheepfold** – allowing anyone who enters through him to be safe. (Jn 10:9) These Gospel passages serve to remind us that Jesus cares deeply about our welfare; his compassion and love is clearly evident.

Today, the Fifth Sunday of Easter, we have yet another metaphor: **Jesus as the vine**, and we, being his disciples, are the branches – 'Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty...'. (15:5). As his baptised disciples, we're inextricably connected to Jesus. We enjoy a special symbiotic relationship with Jesus. We need Him in our lives, but our Lord needs us to continue His initial work by taking His Good News to the wider world.

God's eternal plan for his human creation, us, is that we should share His Heavenly home with Him for all eternity. Jesus' ministry, which concluded with his Death and Resurrection, had the effect of rendering all humanity eligible to be with Him in His eternal and Heavenly home, provided we are worthy to be there. The onus is truly on us. We are responsible for what we do and say; but God, via the Church's seven Sacraments, gives us the means and graces that help us stay true to Him. His sacrificial gift to us is unsurpassable in its efficacy and each of us should remember that sacrifice with gratitude each day of our lives.

Our Parish is just one month away from the annual celebration of the Feastival – the Solemnity Patronal Feasts of the Holy Trinity (Banyo) and Corpus Christi (Nundah). Progress is being made towards our inaugural Corpus Christi Street Procession. I will report back to you in a subsequent Newsletter Message about our Corpus Christi Procession preparations, but for now, I would like Parishioners to add a date claimer to your diaries for Sunday, 2 June 2024; that is when our Procession and our public witness to our Lord will occur. The basic program for Corpus Christi Sunday is, that after the conclusion of the 9:30am Nundah Sunday Mass, Parishioners would assemble and commence the street Procession from the Church carpark down through Nundah Village and back to the carpark; the March will commence at 11:00am. The Procession will be led by me carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a monstrance. Upon our return to the Nundah Church, solemn Exposition and Adoration will occur until 1:00pm. The festivities will conclude with Benediction beginning at 1:00pm. We hope to offer participants food and drink stalls on the day too.

May the week ahead be a joyful one for all. God bless! Fr Dan. Parish Priest.

We pray that You will continue to guide us and sustain us.


