Pentecost Sunday 19th May 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

There is quite a lot occurring in our Archdiocese this weekend. Yesterday (Saturday), our Archbishop concelebrated a Mass in the Cathedral of St Stephen to mark his **Golden Jubilee of Priestly Ordination**. Concelebrating with him were the massed clergy of the Archdiocese and his Brother Bishops from around Australia including our Canberra-based Apostolic Nuncio. Then, today, again in the Cathedral, the Archbishop will lead the **Sesquicentenary Finale** (150 years) celebrations for the Cathedral. You may well remember how our Parish, in turn, received the Sesquicentenary Message Stick inviting us to participate in the prayerful and joyful celebration of the upcoming sesquicentenary. And all this is in addition to the Universal Church's Solemnity Celebration of it's birth, the Feast of Pentecost. On behalf of the people of our Parish, I congratulate Archbishop Mark Coleridge on achieving fifty years (28 years as a Priest, 22 years as a Bishop – 12 years as Archbishop Mark in your prayers.

As was noted in the previous paragraph, today is **Pentecost Sunday**, the day on which the Holy Spirit descended on the gathered Apostles and the Mother of our Lord, all of whom were sheltering in a locked room in deep prayer, praying for the Holy Spirit to come. And in answer to their pravers, and in fulfilment of our Saviour's promise, the Holy Spirit did come. It was the fiftieth day after our Lord's Resurrection and ten days after His Ascension. Great phenomena marked the Holy Spirit's arrival too; tongues of fire alighted on the heads of all in the room, and a great wind blew within that locked and sealed room too. And then, filled with the Holy Spirit, they all emerged from that room of refuge to testify unequivocally to the truth that Jesus was indeed the promised Messiah, and that he had risen from the dead after three days, and that he has ascended to sit at the righthand of the Father, with Peter being the lead spokesperson. His testimony was heard by all present in the crowd in their own language simultaneously - that was the gift of speaking in tongues at work. In the Acts of the Apostles (our First Reading from the Mass of the Day), we read how the assembled crowd ponder: 'How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

As I have previously reported in last weekend's Newsletter Message, today during our 9:30am Sunday Mass, the four people who aren't baptised but are on the journey of discovery that will eventually see them become full members of our Church community, will take the first step towards that reality by being accepted as Catechumens. The Rite of Acceptance will begin immediately after the praying of the Collect, and before the commencement of the Liturgy of the Word. There are a number of responses that the Catechumens Sponsors and the assembled People of God present at this Mass should reply. When asked if you are ready to help these candidates to find and follow Christ, the response would be 'We are.' As I sign the Catechumens foreheads and various senses, the response would be 'Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!' The Liturgy of the Word then commences in the usual form until the Profession of the Faith is completed, at which point, the Catechumens would again come forward to the Sanctuary to be each presented with a Bible. After the presentation, the Mass continues with special intercessory prayers. Mass continues as per usual thereafter. Please keep all six RCIA Candidates, Sakiko, Jennifer, Myles, Felix, David and Carlie, in your prayers.

The children who are preparing to receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit (the same Gifts incidentally that the Apostles and our Heavenly Mother received at that first Pentecost) when they make their Confirmation on Friday week, will be presented with a copy of The Apostles' Creed after the praying of three Hail Mary's for peace in the Ukraine and the Holy Land, at all Masses today. Please keep these children in your prayers too, in these final days of their sacramental journey. Thank you!

A reminder again that our Parish Feastival (combining and unifying our two Mass Centre Feast Days) begins next Sunday with the Feast of The Most Holy Trinity. Our Parish is blessed with a wide cross-section of ethnicities which brings its own richness and diversity to our lives. And as a means of recognising and appreciating this diversity, one representative from each ethnicity will be invited to process the flag of their birth-country into the Banyo Church at the beginning of our 7:30am and 5:00pm Masses, and to lay down their flags before the Altar. You will be surprised by the number of flags that will be so presented.

Then, a week later, the Feastival will conclude with Feast of Corpus Christi. The Parish will conduct its Corpus Christi Procession from Corpus Christi Church down into Nundah Village and back from 11:00am. I thank all who have volunteered to assist with the Street Procession and the subsequent Parish celebrations, but we are still in need of more volunteers. The clipboard will again be put out for people to self-nominate their services. Unfortunately, because there were few volunteers offering to help with the setting-up and cleaning-up afterwards, and with the preparation of barbecue food, the Parish has made the decision to abandon the hot food component of the celebrations for this year, and go solely with serving hot and cold drinks from our Nolan Parish Hall. Please help the Parish to finalise the planning by adding your name to the vacancies listed on the clipboard. Thank you again.

May the fruits of the Holy Spirit - **love**, **joy**, **peace**, **patience**, **kindness**, **goodness**, **trustfulness**, **gentleness** and **self-control** – enrich your lives into and through our Parish Feastival celebrations and beyond.
