If you go into a church this weekend, you will notice that the colours have changed! Things which were white for Easter are now red for Pentecost. The priest will be wearing red too. What does the colour red make you think of?

Today we are going to listen to a reading from the Acts of the Apostles. It tells the story of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came. Jesus' friends were together in one room, when they heard a sound like a huge wind. A tongue of fire came and rested above each person. The disciples started speaking different languages so that all the people could understand the wonderful things that God had done.

The Scriptures

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

2:1-8, 11

On the day of Pentecost

all the Lord's followers were together in one place.

Suddenly there was a noise from heaven like the sound of a mighty wind!

It filled the house where they were meeting.

Then they saw what looked like fiery tongues moving in all directions,

and a tongue came and settled on each person there.

The Holy Spirit took control of everyone, and they began speaking

whatever languages the Spirit let them speak.

Many religious Jews from every country in the world were living in Jerusalem.

And when they heard this noise, a crowd gathered.

But they were surprised, because they were hearing everything in their own languages.

They were excited and amazed, and said:

Some of us were born Jews, and others of us have chosen to be Jews.

Yet we all hear them using our own languages to tell the wonderful things God has done."

Group Activity

Pentecost - A Birthday Party for the Church


- Prepare tables set with red, orange, and yellow tablecloths, plates, and napkins. Have some party music playing.
- An additional activity for early finishers could be "Pin the flame on the disciples".
- ♣ Have a cake to celebrate this special birthday (provided there are no allergies). Be sure to include candles. Talk about the similarities to the tongues of fire that rested on the disciples' heads at Pentecost – the birthday of the Church. Children can help to blow out the candles.

FLAME PARTY CROWN - CRAFT ACTIVITY

- 1. Cut out all the pieces. Either trace the flame shapes onto red, yellow and orange paper, or ask children to colour them in.
- 2. Glue the flame pieces together.
- 3. Trace the rectangle template onto construction paper. You will need about three of these for each child.
- 4. Glue or staple the rectangular parts together to create one long band.
- 5. Ask the children to glue their flame shapes to the middle of the band.
- 6. For each child, wrap the band around their head, and fix to the required length with sticky-tape, or a couple of paper clips.
