Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

6 October 2024 — Year B

Dear Parishioners,

It feels great to be back home and with you after a very relaxing vacation. Lord Howe Island, where I spent 21 days, is a beautiful, remote island that lies due east of Port Macquarie, NSW, and has the southernmost coral reefs in the Pacific Ocean. I described the island in a previous Parish Newsletter Message as an Eden. I highly recommend the island to anyone who might be seeking a quiet refuge and a chance to be other worldly. And another plus, you don't need a passport to travel to the island.

I would like to express my gratitude to my brother Priests for covering our Parish's Sunday Masses during my absence on vacation; to Deacon Kelemete Ta'ale for leading the weekly Wednesday Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion services at Banyo; and most especially to our Parish Manager, Debra Visser, for holding things together so competently, whilst also having to deal single-handedly with the funeral arrangements for her mother, Bernadeen Hodby, because her brother and sister were both overseas at the time of her mother's passing. A big thank you too, to other Parish Staff members, Carmel Spargo and Jill Piper, for the way that they supported Debra as she coped with the grief of her mother's death, arranging the funeral, whilst simultaneously managing the Parish business.

Tomorrow, Monday, October 7, marks the first anniversary of the Hamas terrorist incursion, massacre of 1,200 Israelis, and the capturing of hostages, before returning to the safety of their Gaza underground tunnels. It was an reprehensible event that appalled many from all around the world. As a Parish, we have responded positively to the Pope's call for prayers for a peaceful end to the Gaza/Israel war for the last twelve months with our praying of three Hail Mary's during or Sunday and Weekday Masses. Prior to the October 7, 2023 event, our Parish was already praying three Hail Mary's for peace to reign in the Ukraine/Russia war. And now, with war having broken out between Israel and Lebanon's Hezbollah militia during this past week, we will broaden our prayers for peace to include this conflict too.

Whilst I was on vacation, I read an article that advised that Easter Sunday in 2025 will have a rare occurrence, and it is this. Easter Sunday next year will see the alignment of the Gregorian and Julian Calendars. The Julian Calendar is used by Eastern Orthodox Churches; the Gregorian Calendar is used by our Church, the Western Rite Church. Pope Gregory XIII authorised the change to our Church's calendar in 1582 because some of our major Church feasts, such as Easter, did not always align with the proper seasons. So, in 2025, all Churches (Eastern and Western) will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, on the same Sunday, April 20. It's just a bit of trivia, but I thought that you be interested to know this.

Finally, I would like to draw your attention to the Statement by the Catholic Bishops of Queensland, **As We Look To The State Election**, a limited number of copies are available today for collection. This is the Catholic Church's official statement in relation to our upcoming October 26 State Election. In their collaboration on the statement, they urge those seeking election at this year's State election to speak the truth, and those who will vote for them (all eligible voters), to use their ballot for the good of all. They conclude their statement with this paragraph: *'In such a world and at this time, we would ask of those seeking election and those who will elect them that, beyond the seductions of the lie, they tell the truth, that they resist the pressures of polarisation and work for the good of all, and that they recognise populism for what it is and fully respect the processes of democracy and the rule of law.'* The Bishops have recorded a video of them delivering their Statement in person, and it is worth viewing. The new liturgical year begins on 1st December. Orders have now closed for Break Open the Word and the Daily Mass Book for 2025.

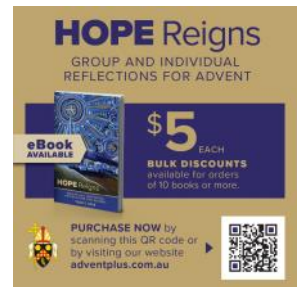

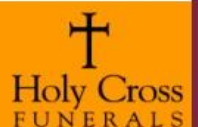
