Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 10 November 2024 — Year B

Dear Parishioners,

The past week has been an eventful one in many ways. I indicated some of these in last weekend's Newsletter Message — calling for Parishioner help for some to come forward and to volunteer their aid as either a RCIA Sponsor (we still need two volunteers) or as a Sponsor (no one has come forward in the past week); the annual running of the Melbourne Cup; the USA Presidential Elections which was convincingly won by President-Elect Donald J Trump (the ramifications of which will certainly have a flow-on effect and will reverberate in other nations, such as ourselves, Australia). Then, in our local Parish, two additional events occurred.

The first occurred on Monday when our long-serving Corpus Christi Church Sacristan, Carmel Power, informed me that her final Mass as Sacristan would be this weekend's 9:30am Mass. Carmel has given many years of dedicated service to the Nundah community, and no one is more appreciative of that service than me. I have witnessed her early presence for Masses, funerals, baptisms, adoration, and other special events, and then to stay on after, when most, if not all Parishioners have vacated the church building, to tidy-up and secure the church before heading home. She literally spent dozens of hours some weeks, supporting me by preparing thoroughly in advance of whatever liturgical event is occurring, and few people would be aware of her sacrificial love for Corpus Christi Church and its Parishioners. Carmel's birthday falls on Saturday, November 9, the day prior to her retirement, and I wish her many more happy returns. It is important that we, as a Parish, acknowledge Carmel Power's dedication and devotion to her many ministries across the decades, but most especially, to her principal ministry as a Sacristan. Carmel, we thank you for your years of service to us.

The second event also occurred early in the week too. The Parish began the work of upgrading the audio-visual systems of Holy Trinity Church. I referred to this particular upgrade in last weekend's published Parish Financial Statement. Well, on Tuesday, the Parish discovered that the contractor installing the system had differed from what was originally specified (namely a wireless rather than a wired sound system environment), and further discussions ensued that afternoon between the Parish and the contractor. By 5:00pm on Tuesday, the issues had all been resolved and the contractor agreed to change what they were installing to meet our original specified requirements. The change has necessitated a variation to the original contract, and regrettably, the project cost will involve greater expense to us. The audio-visual system will be up and running for this weekend's Banyo Masses and Parishioners attending that Church will certainly notice and appreciate the difference between the old and new systems.

My final item is to officially inform Parishioners of the presence in our Parish from next Sunday, November 17, of a Seminarian from the Holy Spirit Provincial Seminary, Banyo. His name is Antony Sebastian, and Antony has kindly provided a short biography and a photograph of himself, as a way of introducing himself to you, the Parishioners of Banyo Nundah. Antony will be with us for six weeks; his final day with us will be for the Christmas Vigil Services on December 24. He will be accompanying me on most of my pastoral ministries in order to grow his practical understanding of what ministerial priesthood entails. Please make Antony welcome.



Introducing Antony Sebastian



Hello, my name is Antony Sebastian and I'm currently a propaedeutic seminarian studying at the seminary of Holy Spirit Provincial seminary in Banyo, Brisbane North. I'm currently 23 years of age. I'm in a family of four which consists of my mother whose name is Judy, my father whose name is Sebastian, my sister who is the youngest sibling in the family, whose name is Mary who is currently 22 years of age and is studying Bachelor of Nursing at Unisa, doing her 2nd year. My nationality is Indian, and I and my family are from Kerala, south India. I studied Bachelor of Health Science for

3 years after finishing my secondary schooling at Parafield Gardens High School and went to The Pines primary for the last semester of Year 7. Before that, my family and I lived in Glenelg, and I did my schooling at St Leonard's Primary School until year 7. My journey to the seminary has been one of discernment and a sense of calling since I was 10. Until then I went to Church and followed the typical norm of a daily Christian life in my family and went with the flow. I experienced a conversion of heart when I had received my first holy communion, I experienced receiving Jesus for the first time. I watched a movie about St Anthony which had moved me and from there the priesthood was really dwelling and growing within me, praying and discerning, studying at uni, I still felt that this was my true calling as I felt Jesus calling me to another life. I didn't feel drawn to continue to study further with my degree and after another extra year of discernment I came to the seminary. I love to play football and I speak Spanish.
