Then the Son of Man will be seen coming in the clouds with great power and glory. He will send his angels to gather his chosen ones from all over the earth.

Group Activity

STAR AND MOON MOBILE

You will need: a template for each child on cardstock or paper, coloured markers, glitter glue, hole punch, scissors, glue, wool or ribbon, branches or coat-hangers.

- 1. Decorate the stars and moon with markers and glitter glue.
- 2. Cut out the shapes.
- 3. Glue the matching shape to its back (one is patterned and one is blank).
- 4. Punch a hole in the top using a hole punch.
- 5. Tie different lengths of wool or ribbon to each mobile piece.
- 6. Tie the other end of the wool or ribbon to a fallen branch that you find while walking outdoors, or perhaps to a coat-hanger.
- 7. Then hang up your mobile and say a prayer to thank God for the stars and the moon.
