Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners,

Today's liturgies mark the beginning of the most solemn and holy weeks in the Church's liturgical calendar. It begins with the solemn blessing of palms before the triumphant entry into the City of Jerusalem by Jesus, and then, as the week progresses, we are present at the Lord's Last Supper (Holy Thursday liturgy) and His Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane; we witness His arrest; we are present during His trials, His scourging at the pillar, His crowning with a Crown of Thorns, His Crucifixion, Death and Entombment (Good Friday liturgy), and then His triumphant Resurrection (the Easter Sunday liturgies). So much happens to Jesus within this seven days; and the important thing to note is that Jesus, the Innocent Sacrificial Lamb, willingly submitted Himself to these gruelling and humiliating ordeals in complete obedience to the Will of His Heavenly Father. The Easter Triduum incorporates all these facets of the Lord's final journey to Calvary and His Resurrected self.

Attendance at the Sacred Paschal Triduum by Catholics is always desirable and recommended, however, it is not mandatory. These days, there are plenty of distractions that can tend to elevate to higher levels, how one occupies themselves over the four-day Easter long weekend. There are sports, and other recreational or family activities that can be given precedence over one's attendance at religious services. By attending all of the Easter Triduum liturgies, it becomes a true reflection of one's commitment and discipleship to Jesus, our Lord and Saviour. Certainly, the longer than usual liturgies (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil) can test one's stamina, but they can also be likened in their own way to the invitation by Jesus extended to Peter, James and John to keep Him company as He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane. The question that Jesus puts to these three prior to His arrest, could also be applied to all of us, 'So you had not the strength to keep awake with me one hour? You should be awake, and praying not to be put to the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.' (Mt 26:40-41)

Our Sacred Paschal Triduum this year is made all the more special for our three Candidates completing their Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) journey: Lyndal Dashwood, David Gittins and Sophia Lynch. Their spiritual journey towards enlightenment began in late-November 2024, and culminates with their formal admission into the Church during the Easter Vigil. I know that they are looking forward to this important moment in their lives. Please remember them in your prayers throughout this coming week.

- Sunday of the Resurrection, Second Mass Easter Sunday, 9:30am, Corpus Christi Church, Nundah

I would draw to your attention to the following matters too:

- The Parish Office will be closed for business from 3:00pm on Thursday afternoon (17 April) and will reopen for business from 9:00am on Tuesday within the Octave of Easter (22 April), and will close again from 4:00pm on Thursday within the Octave of Easter for the ANZAC day public holiday Friday.
- The Parish's Anzac Day Mass will be celebrated in the Corpus Christi Church, on Friday at 7:00am. This year, because ANZAC Day falls within the Octave of Easter, and the Octave of Easter days rank more highly than Solemnities, the ANZAC Day prayers and readings will not be used this year, although the commemoration can be incorporated, as it will be by this Parish, into the introduction, homily and intercessions.
  - The survey of Parishioners that the Parish recently conducted has been completed. The survey had 5 respondents, and more respondents favoured the 7:00pm Thursday Holy Hour in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, and concluding with Benediction option; this result concurs with the decision taken by the combined PPC and PFC Councillors to implement the Holy Hour with Benediction. The commencement of this liturgical celebration will be from the first Thursday in June (5 June).
- I shall be on vacation from Monday, 28 April until Tuesday, 27 May. During my absence, I have arranged for Fr Bavin Clarke to celebrate all our Parish Sunday Masses, and also, to celebrate a 9:00am Mass in the Corpus Christi Church, on Saturday, 25 May, the Solemnity Feast of Australia's Patronal Saint, Our Lady, Help of Christians. Weekday Masses will be cancelled during my absence. I beg your indulgence.

I trust that the Lord will again bless all your endeavours throughout the week ahead, and may it be a special and memorable Holy Week for everyone. God bless!

May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel.



As Easter quickly approaches with all the busy-ness that entails, now might be a great time to make your Project Compassion donation online, by scanning the QR Code on page 4 or




