Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord 20th April, 2025 — Year C

HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA!

Dear Parishioners,

Our penitential Season of Lent is but a memory now. We, as a Church, now begin the Season of Easter which is a period of rejoicing and celebration, that begins with the revelatory news that the Lord has risen from the dead, and continues with sporadic appearances by Jesus to his Apostles and disciples before his Ascension to his throne at the right hand of the Father, and concludes with the joyful descent of the Holy Spirit on all who were gathered together in the locked room, marking the official birth of the Church. We have a lot to look forward to across the next seven Sundays.

Last night, during the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, we welcomed into our Church and Parish family, three new members: Lyndal Dashwood, Sophia Lynch and David Gittins. On behalf of the Parish, I offer Lyndal, Sophia and David our congratulations, and extend an invitation for them to consider deepening their involvement in our Parish by serving in one or more of the Parish's liturgical ministries. But, I should also add that they did not complete their journey of faith alone, they were supported by a team of Sponsors/Godparents and Catechists. So, I would also pass along my gratitude for the companionship of Elena Knol, Jim Scotland and Joseph Mortimer, Lyndal, Sophia and David's respective Sponsors, and to Dcn Kelemete Ta'ale, Norma Gomes and Fred Gomes, who served as Catechists. Thank you so much!

This weekend marks the end of the mid-semester Queensland school vacations and also, it is a long weekend with a Public Holiday tomorrow, so inevitably, there will be heavy traffic to be expected on our roads. Please remember to drive carefully and patiently, particularly if you are caught up in that holiday traffic.

This year we have consecutive long-weekends for this and the next two weekends, so that has an impact on our Parish's operations. but beyond that, I can't say what will be involved. The Aspley Parish Office phone number is 3862 9402, so if you are interested in attending this service, please direct your enquiries to them.

There are a number of weekday Mass cancellations that will apply. The first is for tomorrow (Monday within the Octave of Easter), the 7:00am Nundah Mass is a cancellation. Then, whilst I am away, commencing Monday 28 April through and including Monday 26 May, all the regular weekday Masses will be cancelled. The regular Parish weekday Masses will resume on Wednesday, 28 May. The Saturday afternoon Confession sessions are also cancelled during my absence, they will resume on Saturday, 31 May.

One final reminder to conclude my Message. There will be a 7:00am Mass this Friday, 25 April, in the Corpus Christi church. Because ANZAC Day falls within the Octave of Easter, the Octave of Easter Mass has a higher order of priority within the Church's liturgical calendar, so the Readings and Proper for the Day will be for Friday within the Octave of Easter rather than those we would normally use on ANZAC Day, but there will be the Ode and the Last Post included in this Mass. All are most welcome.

May I wish all Parishioners and visitors to this Parish a safe, holy and happy Easter for today, and may it continue throughout the entire Easter Season.

May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel.


