The Ascension of the Lord 1st June, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners.

It's really great to be back home and among you again. I had a great and relaxing four week vacation visiting family in my home city of Mackay, and then lazing around Sydney and Surfers Paradise the remainder of the time. I feel reinvigorated again and ready to continue my pastoral ministry with you.

I should like to acknowledge the good and important work that occurred in our Parish in my absence. I mentioned during my Sunday Masses on the Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday), my confidence in entrusting the day-to-day administration of the Parish to Debra Visser, our Parish Manager. From listening to feedback from various people, I know that my trust has been vindicated, and I thank Debra and her subordinate staff for the superlative work that they have undertaken and achieved. A good amount of this work related to advancing the restorative work of the Corpus Christi Church to almost being at the commencement stage; our Parish Finance Councillors were also integrally involved in this process. It should be noted that when the restoration work does begin, all Church services that would ordinarily occur in the Corpus Christi Church would be relocated to the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, for the duration of that work. You will, of course, be duly informed in advance about when the church closure would come into effect.

A debt of gratitude is also owed to Fr Bavin Clarke, who celebrated our Parish Sunday Masses as well as a special Saturday morning Mass for the Co-Patroness of Australia, Our Lady, Help of Christians. I have spoken to Fr Bavin since my return and personally thanked him for his work. He said that he was ably assisted by a number of Parishioners during the past month, particularly the Sacristans, and again, Debra Visser, and together, you have made his work a little easier and manageable. So, thank you to all who rendered assistance to Fr Bavin.

Whilst I was away, a number of major events occurred internationally, e.g. the Conclave, Election and Installation of Pope Leo XIV; nationally, e.g. the Federal Election and the return of the Albanese Labor Government; and locally within our Parish, e.g. the Confirmation sacramental program formal enrolment and the commencement of the confirmation workshops with the candidates; and an accident necessitating immediate orthopaedic surgery to a longstanding stalwart of our Parish, Fred Gomes. Of course, I know too, that there are many other Parishioners who are dealing with major health issues too. These events, and numerous other sundry ones, all have an impact in or on our lives. The Gospel readings for the past five Sundays of Easter repeated call for the disciples of Christ to practice love – love of God and love of neighbour. So, then, with Christ at our side, we are able to respond positively to good, bad and indifferent news of the world.

Funerals with Faith - Caring for Your Family



I noted that in last weekend's Parish Newsletter, tucked away in the bottom corner of the back page, was a reminder that a Holy Hour of Adoration concluding with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament would commence from Thursday, 29 May (last Thursday). The plan is for the Adoration and Benediction to follow on immediately after the conclusion of the 6:30pm Banyo Thursday Mass. I'm preparing this Message on Thursday morning, so I'm unsure of how well the Adoration and Benediction might be initially received by Parishioners. The addition of weekly Adoration and Benediction on a Thursday night is our Parish's pastoral response to the cancellation of the adoration sessions previously held on a Monday/Tuesday ones in the Nundah church and the Tuesday/Wednesday ones in the Banyo church. Whilst the commencement of Adoration and Benediction liturgies was a personal initiative of myself (and it does come at a personal cost and with additional work for me), it is important that Parishioners be aware that should attendance at these weekly liturgies fall away, there is the possibly that they could be discontinued for want of interest. For my part, I dedicate and commit myself to leading

these liturgies whilst they remain viable numbers wise.

The Parish will shortly enter into a very busy phase of life. Our two Parish Patronal Feast Days will soon be upon us again; they begin in a fortnight's time with the Solemnity Feast of the Most Holy Trinity (Banyo) and then, on the following Sunday, the Solemnity Feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) for Nundah. Fr Bernie Gallagher coined the term 'Feastival' as a way of conjointly celebrating the consecutive Parish Feasts in a way that expresses unity in our Parish. Our Parish logo actually encapsulates this with the partial quote from John 17:21, 'May they all be one'. Our celebratory plans for the 2025 Feastival include two events: the first, during the Banyo 7:30am Mass on Sunday, 15 May, we will again have a procession of National Flags honouring the heritage of our countries of birth – our Parish is multi-ethnic – and then, at the conclusion of this same Mass, the Parish Care and Concern group will serve breakfast in Brady Hall. The second event will be the Corpus Christi Street Procession leading away from and returning to Corpus Christi church via Nundah Village. This year, we plan to be a little bit better organised than our inaugural march last year. This year, we hope to have food and drink vendors available in the Corpus Christi church carpark. This year's march will form up in the church carpark, before moving away under the supervision of members of the Queensland Police Service. The march should commence around 10:50am. Then, upon its return, there will be a period of adoration until 11:45am, and our celebration will conclude with Benediction. The Parish will be looking for volunteers to serve again as parade marshals (3 required), cross bearer (1 required), first aid officer (1 required), baldachin bearers (4 required), candle bearers (2 required), and banner bearer teams of two for the following groups: SVDP Conferences, Corpus Christi, Care and Concern, and Laudate Si. Because the march is just three weeks away, it is important that we finalise the volunteer roles prior the weekend of Holy Trinity Sunday. I therefore ask all who can serve in any of these volunteer roles to liaise with the Parish Manager (33224 3870) promptly. ...continued on page three

I have one final matter to address in my Message. The Parish Manager on page 3 of last weekend's Newsletter, included a Date Claimer for a Mass of Thanksgiving for the soon to be ordained Dcn Sean Patrick Woods, which will occur on Saturday, 14 June, in our Corpus Christi church, commencing at 6:00pm. Arrangements have been made for a limited number of people to attend the supper in Nolan Hall after the conclusion of the Thanksgiving Mass. I trust that the week ahead will be a blessed and fulfilling one for each of you.


