The Most Holy Trinity Sunday 15th June, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners,

A number of BIG events are occurring in our Parish this weekend and continuing through to and including next weekend - our Feastival Week. I've mentioned them in last week's Parish Newsletter, but, since they are important and concern all of us, I'll outline them again.

The first event is the Thanksgiving Mass for the newly ordained Priest, Fr Sean Woods. Fr Sean was a member of this Parish community before entering Holy Spirit Provincial Seminary to study for the priesthood. His Thanksgiving Mass will also serve as this weekend's Vigil Mass. Then, following Mass, those who have obtained tickets for the celebratory supper immediately afterwards, will adjourn to Nolan Hall for the supper event and the presentation of our Parish's monetary gift to Fr Sean. I sincerely thank all who have assisted in organising and running everything associated with Fr Sean's Thanksgiving, and to all who contributed to the gift.

This weekend is, of course, the Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity, and therefore, it is also the patronal feast day for our Banyo Church. This feast day also marks the beginning of our Parish's Feastival which is a celebration on consecutive Sundays of the Parish's church's patronal feast days. The principal celebration of Trinity Sunday will be the procession of the national flags of the countries-of-birth of our broad ethnic Parish community at the commencement of the 7:30am Mass, and it will be followed immediately after with a breakfast meal and raffles to assist the Banyo SVDP Conference. Again, I sincerely thank everyone who assists with the meal and fundraising activities.

Then on Friday evening, the Parish Confirmations will be celebrated for 61 candidates. The administration of this Sacrament will mark the culmination of all their preparatory work with the Parish Sacramental Coordinator, Angela Greathead. On behalf of the candidates and their families, I offer my thanks to Angela for her leadership.

And next weekend, it is the turn of the Nundah community to celebrate its church feast day, Corpus Christi (The Holy Body and Blood of Christ). Our principal celebration will occur after the conclusion of the 9:30am Nundah Mass, when I, carrying the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance, will head the Corpus Christi Street March away from Corpus Christi church, down and through Nundah Village, and then back to the church for a period of adoration and concluding with Benediction; the Benediction will commence at 11:20am. Food and refreshments will be served after the March in the Parish Centre. Those who are frail or can't physically manage the March are invited to watch the March head out and return from the comfort of the Parish Centre's Father Martin Jordan Meeting Room. The March serves as a public display and our witness to our faith in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. The March should depart around the 10:45am mark.

This is unnecessary, as our recording only allows for us to record one amount given (which is the total of all giving for a particular Sunday). We are also wanting to align ourselves with *Laudato Si* principles of looking after our environment. These envelopes don't have dates on them. Please use one envelope per weekend that you attend Mass here. If you miss a Mass, there is no wastage of paper and printing costs.
