On Wednesday evening, the Archdiocese received the good news that Pope Leo XIV had accepted the resignation of Archbishop Mark Coleridge and appointed his successor who is Bishop Shane Mackinlay, Bishop of Sandhurst. Archbishop Mark will continue on the Apostolic Administrator of our Archdiocese until Archbishop-elect Mackinlay's installation in St Stephen's Cathedral on 11th September. We are asked to keep our Archbishop-elect Mackinlay in our prayers.

Last Saturday evening, the Parish joined with the newly ordained Archdiocesan Priest, Fr Sean Woods, and his family, to give thanksgiving to the Lord for the grace of his acceptance of the Lord's calling to ordained ministry. It was an uplifting experience for all who attended the Mass. The supper that followed, was also a joyful celebration.



Fr Sean, at the end of the evening's events, mentioned quietly to me his appreciation for all the work that the Parish had done to make his Thanksgiving celebrations so memorable for him.

I would now like to take the opportunity to again thank all who had any role, even in the minutest way, for offering your services and making Fr Sean's Thanksgiving celebrations so memorable for him.



This weekend marks the end of our Parish Feastival week. It ends with a crescendo - our

Annual Corpus Christi Street Procession passing through the streets of Nundah Village. Now, I'm aware that I have been 'banging the drum' a little over the past fortnight (in Newsletter Messages and in end-of-Mass announcements) about vehicle parking in the Nundah church car park for those who will attend the 9:30am Mass there today, but it is important that I do so one final time. I do so because I am mindful of the general safety of all the marchers who will participate in today's Corpus Christi Street Procession. So, please, if you WILL NOT BE participating in the Procession, DO NOT PARK your vehicle in the car park today. Please park your vehicle by the kerb in one of the nearby streets. Priority will be given within the car park to form-up the marchers, so, therefore know, that should you choose to park within the car park and you will not be marching, your vehicle will be prevented from departing the car park UNTIL AFTER the marchers move off in procession. And that will be around the 10:45am mark, so I thank you for your understanding and patience.

For those who will find the march to strenuous for them to manage, the Parish Centre will be open to allow you, in airconditioned comfort, to watch the procession depart and return to the Nundah church, and then to join in with the festivities.

Thank you also both to the marchers and to all who have worked behind the scenes to make our second Annual Street Procession a success.

Our Corpus Christi celebrations will conclude with a short period of adoration followed by benediction which will commence at 11:20am. Food and drinks will be served in the Parish Centre upon the return of the marchers to the church.

May the Lord continue to bless you throughout the week ahead.

BIOGRAPHY OF ARCHBISHOP-ELECT SHANE MACKINLAY

Bishop Shane Mackinlay was born in Melbourne in 1965 and attended the local government school until his family moved to Ballarat in 1975. In Ballarat, he was a student at St Francis Xavier Primary School and St Patrick's College, where he was dux in 1982. He has two siblings and is the uncle of five nieces and nephews.

He studied for the priesthood at Corpus Christi College, Clayton, completing theology studies at Catholic Theological College and a degree in physics at Monash University. As a deacon, he served in the parish of Warrnambool, before being ordained as priest for the Ballarat Diocese in 1991, and serving in the parishes of Hamilton, Colac and Ballarat Cathedral. He then undertook graduate studies in philosophy at the Catholic University of Leuven, Belgium, where he completed a Master's degree and a Doctorate. His doctoral thesis was published by Fordham University Press.

Bishop Mackinlay was administrator of the Casterton parish for six months and parish priest of the Sebastopol parish for four years. He was parish priest of the Bungaree parish from 2005 until his appointment as bishop; from 2009, he also provided weekend sacramental ministry for the neighbouring parish of Gordon.



For several years, he taught philosophy at Australian Catholic University, Ballarat. Most of his teaching has taken place at Catholic Theological College, Melbourne, where he was appointed Master in 2011. The following year, he was appointed Associate Professor by the University of Divinity.

From 2012 to 2014 he was the spokesperson for the Catholic Church during the Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry into the Handling of Child Abuse by Religious and other Non-Government Organisations.

He was secretary to the Bishop of Ballarat from 1998 to 2001, and was the chairperson of the Bishop's Advisory Council of the Ballarat diocese from when it was established in 2009. He was a member of the College of Consultors of the Ballarat diocese on two occasions and also served six years as Chairman of the two funds that provide support to the active and retired priests of the Ballarat diocese.

Pope Francis appointed Bishop Mackinlay as the eighth Bishop of Sandhurst on 23 July 2019. Since then, he has been elected as Vice-President of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia and one of the Australian delegates to the forthcoming Synod for a Synodal Church. In 2019, he was asked to join the Methodist-Roman Catholic International Commission, and in 2022 was appointed as its Co-Chair.
