# Solemnity Feast of Saints Peter and Paul 29<sup>th</sup> June, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners.

I'll begin this week's Message with a few personal observations on last Sunday's Corpus Christi Street Procession.



- 1. We give thanks to the Lord for blessing us with fine weather for our march.
- 2. The Parish management in the planning and execution phases of the march was an improvement on last year's inaugural march, but I think that there is still room for improvement.
- 3. The march numbers were comparable to last year's march; it was somewhere around the 200 mark.
- 4. Due in part to the reduced period of adoration and the earlier starting time

for benediction (11:20am rather than 1:00pm like last year), more people participated in both. In 2024, we badly miscalculated the duration of the march phase, and it resulted in an extended adoration phase of nearly 2 hours, and I think that only a few people had the

stamina to hang around for benediction.

- 5. A good number of people stayed on for the lunch that commenced after the return to the church by the marchers.
- 6. The WHS issue departing vehicles passing through and around the ranks of people forming up for the march was better controlled this year. The priority for the Parish was and always will be to maintain the general safety of our pedestrian marchers. I did notice that some Parishioners did not heed my warnings, that if they were not intending to march, to park their vehicles outside the church carpark or they would be required to wait until the marchers moved off.



The march drew many curious looks from the general public frequenting the establishments in Nundah Village, as our procession passed by. I see that as a good thing because it just may heighten the consciousness and reawaken their faith in Jesus. God, alone, truly knows how our march will impact on people's lives.

We had a good response from volunteers who carried banners and the baldachin or served as march marshals and first aid officer or those who assisted with the catering afterwards or the rosary leaders; our church sacristan and altar servers; and I am deeply grateful for your help. It did help that the Parish had locked down the names of volunteers a week ahead of the march, so that the Parish avoided trying to find volunteers at the last minute. I am also most grateful to the Queensland Police Service for their traffic management. Much of this year's success can be attributed to our Parish Manager, Debra Visser, for a lot of the behind-the-scenes work, and I sincerely thank her for her help.

I pray that next year's Corpus Christi Street Procession, which will occur in our centenary year, will be an even greater success

I want to also give Parishioners a heads-up warning about the Australian Christian Art Prize (ACAP) competition that our Parish is running. You may have noticed the small promo that has been appearing in our weekly Newsletter for the past month. The promo was an invitation to enter the art competition. But what many Parishioners might not be aware of that the ACAP is a fundraising initiative of your Parish Finance Council (PFC), to source external income into our Parish so that the Parish will not be reliant solely on Mass collection monies as our principal source of income.

The ACAP competition is in its final stages. What is left to be done, are things that we, as a Parish, will need to do, so a number of volunteers will be required.

Within this Newsletter, is a supplement that will inform Parishioners in greater detail exactly how the ACAP competition works, the two categories of competition and the prize pool, and the specific areas and tasks in which volunteers from our Parish will be needed.

The PFC are of the view that the potentiality for the ACAP to grow in successive years, would mean that the ACAP would be a major source of income to the Parish. But to achieve this longer -term goal, the Parish needs to show to the art world that we are organised and competent. And the best way to demonstrate this is for the people of our Parish to back the initiative through their voluntary labour at the business end of the competition, which is the exhibition of the artwork.

Archbishop-elect Shane Mackinlay shares Jesus' invitation to 'come and see' in first visit to Brisbane

ARCHBISHOP-elect Shane Mackinlay touched down in Brisbane from his diocese of Sandhurst as part of a short stay today to introduce himself, to see the archdiocese and meet with leaders and staff.

He offered a message of welcome and hope as he toured the archdiocese the day after his appointment by Pope Leo XIV.

He had been to Brisbane many times before but this trip he came with a different perspective – the idea of being archbishop front of his mind.

Talking with The Catholic Leader, he said proclaiming the Gospel today, the Church needed to be "clear and unembarrassed about our faith – and about why it matters to us".

Archbishop-elect Mackinlay, 60, said his election was a "big shift" for him but at the same time, was familiar with change over the course of his ministry.

While his appointment as Bishop of Sandhurst in 2019 kept him within familiar territory, being the neighbouring diocese to his home in Ballarat, it had come with a whole different level of involvement in the national and international Church.

"Here (in Brisbane), that national and international connection is something I'm already familiar with but I'm very conscious that I'm not from here, I don't know the place.

"I'm going to have to do a lot of learning of the people, of the culture, of the history – and I'm really looking forward to that."

He said as he moved to positions of greater responsibility, "inevitably you move back from the day to day connection, which I have always loved".

"My last parish I was in for 15 years, while I was in charge of the (Catholic Theological College) and it was a group of small communities that I got to know very closely.

"I still miss that connection.

"But I've learned more and more over time, both to connect as much as I can with the people I am around but also to operate through various layers of entrusting people to be responsible in their area."

He said what made a bishop's life so busy and yet so fascinating was "you see bits of everything that's happening around the place".

"My job is to be aware of what they're doing, to give some guidance and to keep everything connected," he said.

Archbishop-elect Mackinlay's installation Mass will be celebrated on September 11, which is slightly longer than the customary two-month period, which he said was due to some existing commitments.


