Pentecost Sunday 8th June, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners,

The Solemnity Feast of Pentecost celebrates the coming down of the Holy Spirit into the world as promised by our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, onto all the people gathered in the sealed room. The Holy Spirit manifested its presence in a physical way both as a powerful wind and tongues of fire. The Spirit gifted the people present with glossolalia, the phenomenon of speaking in an unknown language. Today's Feast marks the birth of the Church.

Pentecost this year also marks the beginning of an intensive period of Parish activities within the life of our Parish.

Tomorrow, Monday, June 9, will be the final 7:00am Weekday Mass in the Corpus Christi Church. The Monday Mass at Corpus Christi will continue but at the later time of 9:00am. The reason for this permanent change is that my day on a Monday, starts often before 6:30am and continues right through, often uninterrupted until late in the evening to 9:00pm or so with Parish meetings and other RCIA Sacramental Program duties, and those long hours of duty are having an effect on my health. The first 9:00am Monday Mass will occur on June 16. The change in Mass time also has the benefit of enabling the students from St Joseph's Primary, Nundah, to be able to attend Mass from time-to-time on Mondays and/or Fridays.

Later this week, on Friday evening, there is the presbyteral ordinations of Dcns Sean Woods (Sean's home Parish is this Parish) and Sang Duc Dui in the Cathedral of St Stephen's. On Saturday morning in Corpus Christi Church, there are two baptism sessions. On Saturday afternoon, also in Corpus Christi Church, will be a Wedding Mass for Nicholas Leonardi and Shannon O'Reilly. Then that night, Saturday evening, the Corpus Christi Church 6:00pm Vigil Mass will serve as the venue for the newly ordained priest, Fr Sean Woods' Thanksgiving Mass. It will be followed by a reception for Fr Sean in Nolan Hall. Then on Sunday, particularly during the 7:30am Mass at Holy Trinity Church, the Parish will celebrate that church's Patronal Feast Day, The Most Holy Trinity. I'll provide a little more about the particularities of this celebration a little later.

Then, moving into the following week, the Parish will celebrate the Confirmation of children enrolled in the current Sacramental Program on Friday night in Corpus Christi Church. Saturday morning in Holy Trinity Church, more baptisms will be celebrated. Then on Saturday night and Sunday, on the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), the Parish will celebrate the Patronal Feast Day of the Corpus Christi Church community. The major celebration will occur after the conclusion of the Corpus Christi Street Procession down and through Nundah Village, followed by a brief period of Adoration and concluding with Benediction. Learning lessons from our 2024 Street Procession, all celebrations will conclude by 11:30am.

There will be food and drinks available again for march participants to consume once the March returns to the Corpus Christi Church grounds. It would be helpful if Parishioners might be able to bring along a plate of goodies for a communal sharing of food.

Just to complicate things a bit more for me in the days preceding Corpus Christi Sunday, I have a medical procedure (day surgery) on Tuesday, and because I will be under a general anaesthetic (and therefore cannot drive in the 24 hours following), it is necessary for me to cancel the 9:00am Wednesday morning Mass at Banyo. In fact, I will be taking Wednesday, June 18, off as a sick day. My apologies for the inconvenience that it may cause the regular Mass goers.

Then in the week beginning with Corpus Christi Sunday, there is the Solemnity Feast of the Nativity of St John the Baptist on Tuesday, June 24. As it is a solemnity, I will be celebrating a 9:00am Mass in the Corpus Christi Church. Then again, later in the week, on Friday, June 27, the Solemnity Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus occurs, and the celebration of this Mass will be at the usual 9:00am time in the Corpus Christi Church. That Sunday will be the Solemnity of Sts Peter and Paul, Apostles. The annual Peter's Pence Collection will be taken up during that weekend's Parish Masses.

Now, backtracking to the 7:30am Sunday Mass celebration of Trinity Sunday. As part of that celebration, the Parish will again conduct a procession by Parishioners of flags representing the countries of their birth. This year, the Parish intends to be a little better organised, and instead of approaching people in the final minutes before we start Mass, we are asking those Parishioners who would be attending the 7:30am Banyo Sunday Mass to write down their name (we only require one person per national flag) this weekend. Our Parish boasts a wide ethnic base, and the procession of flags is an opportunity to showcase our multi-ethnicity as an example of our Christian unity. Now, it would also be appropriate for Parishioners to come dressed in their national costumes, should they like to. Then, immediately following the 7:30am Mass, a free breakfast will be served in the nearby Brady Hall, so please plan to stay on for that too.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge again, the generous gift of a gold-plated chalice and paten to the Corpus Christi Church community by Anthony (Tony) Gilmartin. I did announce this publicly during last weekend's Parish Sunday Masses, but it was too late to be included in last weekend's Parish Newsletter. On behalf of Banyo Nundah Parish, I thank Tony for his gift and assure him that those vessels will be used regularly and often.

May the Lord continue to bless us and our endeavours throughout the busy period that lies immediately ahead for our Parish.
