World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Dear Parishioners,

As part of the first stage of renovation and repairs to Corpus Christi Church, the Parish has engaged Realm Building Solutions to carry out the works. Legally, the company has had access to the site since the signing of the contract. However, they generously allowed us an additional week to continue using the church and part of the carpark. That grace period concluded with last weekend's Sunday Masses.

This week, Realm Building Solutions has installed safety fencing around the church property, officially designating it as a construction site. As a result, parts of the church grounds are now restricted and closed to all unauthorised visitors.

One issue that arose recently involved pedestrian access across the carpark from Bage Street to the St Joseph's Primary School playground gate. While the School had hoped to maintain this route for parents and students, the Parish has determined that it cannot continue — primarily due to safety and public liability concerns. Shared spaces between vehicles and pedestrians present a significant risk. You may recall during our recent Corpus Christi Street Procession that pedestrians were given priority over vehicles. In this case, the situation is reversed: vehicles must now take precedence to ensure safety.

Due to the construction, the Nundah church carpark is operating at approximately 20% capacity. The remaining spaces are allocated as follows:

- **4 marked bays** for Parish staff
- **2 bays** rented to Mary MacKillop College staff on school days
- **3 bays** for visitors attending business at the Parish Centre

Unfortunately, this means that visitors to Mary MacKillop College, St Joseph's Primary School, or the Sisters of St Joseph Convent will need to find kerbside parking elsewhere. These restrictions will remain in place until construction is complete and the barricades are removed.

We understand that many Parishioners have children attending St Joseph's Primary School or Mary MacKillop College. This update is provided for your awareness and planning.

- **Mary MacKillop College families** should continue using the designated Bage Street drop-off zone provided by Brisbane City Council.
- **St Joseph's Primary School families** may still use the church carpark for drop-off and pick-up, but only for brief stops. Vehicles must not be parked or left unattended. Parents wishing to escort their children into school should seek kerbside parking nearby.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation during this period of transition. These measures are in place to ensure everyone's safety and to support the smooth progress of our church renovations.
