Dear Parishioners,

As we continue walking together in faith, I'm pleased to share with you our Parish's **Annual Financial Report for 2024**, which is now available.

I hope you find this Report informative and reassuring. On **page 4**, you'll find a graph showing the average monthly Mass collections. Sadly, our income has returned to levels we last saw in 2021 — perhaps reflecting the cost-of-living challenges many households face today.

Mass collections remain our parish's **main source of income**, supporting the ministries and services that touch the lives of so many — from preparing children for the Sacraments to pastoral care for our seniors and outreach programs for those in need. Contributions come through various means: loose donations, envelopes, direct debit, credit cards, and our **Tap & Go machines**.

Earlier this week, our **Parish Finance Council** met to review the financials for the first half of 2025. They noted that our collections are currently \$15,000 below our modest budget. Should this trend continue, we may end the year down by around **\$30,000**, returning us to levels experienced during the height of COVID-19. The Council is monitoring this closely, and we remain hopeful, trusting in your ongoing support and generosity.

On a joyful note, our **2025 Penance and First Eucharist Candidates** have reached the midpoint of their Sacramental journey. The children will make their **First Confessions this weekend**, and I sincerely thank **Angela Greathead** for her loving guidance. Please keep these young ones in your prayers as they prepare for their **First Holy Communion** on **30–31 August**.

We're also blessed to welcome **Cecilia Formby** from **Marriage Encounter** at this weekend's Masses. She'll speak about the beauty and importance of marriage, and ways couples can strengthen their bond in light of God's grace. In a time when marriage is often misunderstood or undervalued, her words will be a reminder of its sacred place in our lives and community.

May the Lord bless you richly in the days ahead — with peace in your homes, love in your hearts, and joy in your journey of faith.






THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTIONS FOR AUGUST
