The Exaltation of the Holy Cross—Year C 14th September, 2025 Safeguarding Sunday

Dear Parishioners,

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Today we celebrate the Cross — not as a symbol of defeat, but as the triumph of God's redeeming love. In the wilderness, the Israelites were healed by gazing upon the bronze serpent (Numbers 21:4–9). In the fullness of time, we are healed by looking upon Christ crucified — God's own Son, lifted up for our salvation.

St. Paul reminds us that Jesus, though divine, emptied Himself in humility, embracing death on a cross (Philippians 2:6–11). This is the mystery we exalt: the Creator stooping low to lift His beloved creation high.

"For God so loved the world..." (John 3:16). The Cross is God's embrace of every human creature, made in His image and redeemed by His mercy. It is the place where divine love meets human frailty — and transforms it.

As we lift high the Cross in our liturgy and lives, may we become signs of hope and healing for others. Let our humility, gratitude, and service reflect the love that first lifted us.


