Third Sunday of Advent — Year A 14th December, 2025

Dear Parishioners,

I'm delighted to report that Fr Dan has had his surgery this week and is recuperating in readiness for the festive season ahead! We are all eagerly awaiting the celebration of The Christmas Story! I share with you, the following reflection on today's readings.



"Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees."

The words of Isaiah open this Sunday's Liturgy of the Word with a song of hope. The wilderness will blossom, the blind will see, the lame will dance, and the ransomed of the Lord will come home rejoicing. Advent joy is not a denial of hardship; it is the conviction that God is already at work transforming what seems barren into places of life.

In the letter of James, we are urged to wait patiently like farmers who trust that the rains will come. This patience is not passive. It is steady faithfulness in the in-between time, when the promise has been spoken but not yet fulfilled. We are called to perseverance, to stand firm and encourage one another while the harvest of God's mercy ripens.

In the Gospel, John the Baptist, now imprisoned, sends messengers to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come?" Jesus answers not with argument but with evidence of compassion: the blind see, the deaf hear, the poor have good news brought to them. The signs Isaiah foretold are unfolding in him. Even in doubt and confinement, John's faith is honoured; his life continues to prepare the way.



This Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of joy, invites us to rejoice not because everything is perfect, but because God is near. Joy grows wherever faith meets patience, wherever people trust that divine love is quietly making all things new. As we light the rose candle, we are

reminded that the dawn is already breaking, and that the Lord we await is already among us, healing, forgiving, and calling us to share in his joy.


