The Baptism of the Lord — Year A **11th January 2026**

Dear Parishioners

My third anniversary as your Parish Priest has just passed. I began my appointment on 7 January 2023, which means we have now reached the halfway point of this six year journey together.

Time certainly moves quickly.

Looking back, I am grateful for all that we have already accomplished as a Parish community. At the same time, much still lies before us. Parish life is never static; it continually responds to the needs of our people, our wider society, and above all, to God's Will. While we make plans and set goals, we also remain flexible and attentive to the signs of the times, ready to adjust as circumstances change locally, nationally, and internationally.

As mentioned previously, both this year and next year will be jubilee years for our Parish. In 2026 we will celebrate the centenary of the blessing and opening of Corpus Christi Church, Nundah, and in 2027 the golden jubilee of Holy Trinity Church, Banyo. Each jubilee year will include three major events: a day long prayer retreat, our annual Corpus Christi Street Procession, and a formal dinner. Similar celebrations will take place in 2027 for Holy Trinity's jubilee.

This weekend's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord brings Christmastide to a close. From Monday we return briefly to Ordinary Time before entering the Season of Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on 18 February.

As we honour the Lord's baptism, we also recall our own. Baptism makes us Christ like, but this likeness unfolds gradually. A saint was once asked late in life whether he was a Christian; he replied, "Not yet." Baptism plants the seed of divine life within us, and it takes a lifetime for that seed to grow and bear fruit.

May the Lord bless you abundantly in the week ahead.
