Second Sunday in Ordinary Time — Year A 18th January 2026

Dear Parishioners

We have now entered the longest season of the Church's year. During this time, the Church turns our attention to the teaching of Jesus and to the daily life of Christian discipleship. The term Ordinary Time can sound misleading, as if this season were unremarkable or unimportant. In truth, nothing in Christian worship is ever "ordinary" in that sense.

After the Second Vatican Council, the traditional designations "after Epiphany" and "after Pentecost" were replaced with Sundays and weeks "in Ordinary Time," numbered sequentially. Here, "ordinary" comes from *ordinal* — simply meaning ordered or counted time.

Ordinary Time is how the Church marks the ongoing rhythm of our life in Christ, Sunday after Sunday, as we celebrate the good news of his death and resurrection. It forms the foundation on which the great seasons of fasting and feasting rest. Its liturgical colour — green — symbolises growth, hope, and the fullness of life in Christ.

Parish liturgy committees often pour great energy into preparing for Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, and then ease off during Ordinary Time. Yet this season deserves the same care. Even if music and decoration are simpler, the essentials of good liturgy remain: well-prepared scripture readings, clear and meaningful symbols, and music that truly supports the rites.

This quieter stretch of the year offers a valuable opportunity to reflect on our Parish's regular patterns of worship and to consider how our Sunday celebrations might be strengthened.

Ordinary Time invites us to recognise the presence of the risen Christ in the everyday life of our community, to explore more deeply the mystery of Christ in all its dimensions, and to celebrate God's grace at work in the ordinary rhythms of human life.

I pray that we will use this season to refresh our parish music repertoire, improve our liturgical spaces, and recruit and form new and continuing liturgical ministers. May we resist the temptation to give less attention to our worship or to our relationship with the Lord and one another.

May the Lord continue to shower you with his abundant grace and blessings.
